

Sabres Finally Bring Jimmy Vesey to Buffalo

With the acquisition of left winger Jimmey Vesey from the New York Rangers, Buffalo Sabres GM Jason Botterill completed the process begun years ago by his predecessor Tim Murray. Vesey had been selected by the Nashville Predators in the third round, 66th overall, of the 2012 NHL Entry Draft. He won the Hobey Baker Award in 2016 as the best player in college hockey.

Nashville guaranteed Vesey a roster spot at the end of the 2015-16 regular season and playoffs. But Vesey informed the Predators he would not be joining their team. He wanted to choose his team as an unrestricted free agent which he would soon become as any college player unsigned four years after they are drafted became a free agent. This was in accordance with the NHL's Collective Bargaining Agreement, which gives teams four years to sign college draftees and thus allows for the drafted player to move to free agency after his senior year.

On June 20, 2016, Murray and the Sabres swapped a third a third round pick in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft to the Predators for Vesey's rights. The trade gave the Sabres a few weeks of exclusive negotiating rights with Vesey before he became a free agent. Despite

this, Vesey's agent informed ESPN that he had still intended to become a free agent. While discussions with the Sabres continued, a deal was not struck and Vesey became an unrestricted free agent on August 16. On August 20, 2016, Vesey signed with the New York Rangers. In three season with the Rangers Vesy tallied 50 goals and 90 assists for 140 points 240 games. The New York Post described his career so far as "Underwhelming."

The Sabres sent another third round pick in the 2021 draft for Vesey while the Rangers erased his \$2.275 million salary cap hit as they cleared cap space to sign top free agent winger Artemi Panari. Vesey is an average NHL winger who knows how to get the puck to the net in 5 on 5 play as shown by

averaging 17 goals in his three NHL seasons. Of course an average winger is an upgrade among the Sabres bottom nine forwards where the team has been woefully inadequate. A twenty goal season from Vesey would be welcome on a team where Jason Pominville's 15 goals was the best total after Jack Eichel, Jeff Skinner and Sam Reinhart. At age 26 Vesey's upside is limited but if he continues to produce 17 goals or more, his production he will be a welcome addition to the team. Interestingly this week the Stanley Cup finalist Boston Bruins declined a trade opportunity for Vesey who is a hometown boy.

Vesey comes from a real hockey family. His father Jim Vesey was an eighth round pick of the St. Louis Blues in the 1984 Entry Draft. He played 15 games in the NHL and was a goal scoring player in the minor professional leagues. He currently works as a scout for the Toronto Maple Leafs. Vesey's younger brother Nolan was drafted by the Leafs in the 2014 draft and was traded to the Edmonton Oilers in June 2018. He has played in the minors over the past two seasons.



Ask Rusty - Spousal and **Survivor Benefits**

Dear Rusty: I worked in my career, but I now get Social Security disability. My husband retired in 2015 at age 66 and took his Social Security at that time. When he is 70 can I get spousal benefits from his Social Security? And if I can't get them when he turns 70, can I get them if he dies before me? I am 5 years younger than my husband, but my health is up and down, so if I die before him can he get spousal benefits from my Social Security? Signed: Kentucky Woman

Dear Kentucky Woman: Since your husband is already receiving his Social Security retirement benefits, you are eligible to collect spousal benefits at any time after you reach age 62, even though you are collecting Social Security Disability benefits (you don't have to wait until he's 70); however, if you start those spousal benefits before you reach your full retirement age they will be reduced. If you claim at or after your full retirement age (66+2 months) your spousal benefit would be 50% of your husband's full retirement age benefit; but if you start earlier

it would be less.

Please note too that your Social Security Disability Insurance benefits will automatically convert to regular Social Security benefits when you reach your full retirement age but will continue at the same amount you were receiving on disability (including the spousal portion). If your husband predeceases you, and you have already reached your full retirement age, you will get 100% of whatever Social Security benefit he was receiving, instead of any disability benefit or spousal benefit you may be receiving. If he passes and you claim survivor's benefits before you reach your full retirement age, those benefits will be reduced to something less than 100% of the benefit he was receiving. How much of a reduction depends upon how many months before your FRA that you start the survivor's benefit. If you were to predecease your husband, he would get survivor's benefits from you only if that benefit is higher than the amount he is already receiving from his own work record.






PRAYER TO ST. JUDE

the United States. Independence Day is the National Day of the United States.

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2, when the Second Continen-tal Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain's rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Commit-

Jefferson as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it two days later on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail: 'The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to

the other, from this time forward forever more.'

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset. Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4

Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Although Declaration. not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as President, also died on July 4, 1831. He was the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872; so far, he is the only U.S. President to have been born on Independence

as is commonly believed.

Ventilation - Always keep the lid open when lighting your grill. Don't close it until you are sure the grill is lit. Keep the grill in a well-ventilated outdoor area, at least ten feet away from the house—and at least three feet away from trees and shrubs. Never cover the bottom of the grill with foil - it can restrict air circulation. Always use and store propane cylinders outdoors in an upright position. After filling or exchanging a cylinder, take it home immediately. While transporting the cylinder, keep your vehicle ventilated and the valve closed or capped. Do not leave the cylinder in your vehicle.

Firing Up The Grill Safely - Never use

matches or lighters to check for leaks. And never use starter fluid with propane grills. Do not smoke while handling a propane cylinder, and keep all flammable materials away from the grill. If the grill does not ignite within ten seconds, turn off the gas, keep the lid open and wait five minutes before trying again. If the igniter fails to light the grill after two or three tries, turn off the gas and replace the igniter according to the manufacturer's instructions. Regularly check the tubes that lead into the burner for blockage from insects or food grease. Never attempt to repair, clean or clear blockages on a hot grill.

General Safety Tips - Always have one person in charge of the fire at all times. Never leave

a hot grill unattended-Never attempt to repair the tank valve or the appliance yourself. See a propane gas dealer or a qualified appliance repair person. Be sure to locate your model number and the manufacturer's consumer inquiry phone number and write them on the front page of your manual.

If you smell gas and you are able to, safely turn off the cylinder vale, turning it to the right (clockwise). Immediately leave the area and call 911 or your local fire department. Before you use the grill again, have a qualified service technician inspect your cylinder.






