Sabres Add Johansson and Jokiharju

During the Sabres eight season playoff drought the Boston Bruins have been to the finals three times winning the Stanley Cup once and losing in seven games twice. If you want to have a successful team the Bruins model would be a good one to emulate. So the Sabres signed free agent left wing Marcus Johansson from the Bruins. Johansson played a big role in Boston's playoff success with four goals and 11 points in 22 games. In the first round he scored the series winning goal in game seven against the Toronto Maple Leafs. He also scored the series winning goal in game six against the Columbus Blue Jackets. Overall Johansson has played 94 playoff games which will be helpful to the organizations young players who hopefully will learn how to play hard and develop into playoff contenders.

The Sabres were able to sign Johansson due to the Bruins tight salary cap situation. His acquisition continues the teams interest in Swedish players. The Sabres have a big need for a number two center. While Johansson has experience at center he is better at left wing so Buffalo's search for a center will likely continue.

The Sabres also ac-quired defenseman Henri Jokiharju from the Chicago Blackhawks in a trade for Alex Nylander. Jokiharju was a first round pick of the Hawks in 2017. He is a right shot defenseman who played junior in the WHL for the Portland Winterhawks. Last season at age 19 he played 30 games in the American league and 38 games in the NHL with 12 assists. He has 2 years left on his entry level contract at \$925,00 per year. He is good at creating offense with the first pass out of the defensive zone and is also a good skater who can carry the puck out of his zone go on the attack. He led all Hawks defensemen in Corsi percentage. While he has good skills he will get his points from being a smart defenseman with high level thinking skills Alex Nylander had

Rochester especially getting his nose dirty getting involved with hard work in the gritty areas of the ice. But he had never shown any type of consistent use of his skills and never looked like he belonged in the NHL during his 19 games for Buffalo. Nylander is another Tim Murray draft pick that Jason Botterill has traded away. With the Sabres in search of a second line center and a surplus of eight right hand defensemen A trade is in the future and Rasmus Ristolainen is the player with the highest asset value.





FCC Robocall Ruling Offers Hope

Seniors may get robocall relief if a new Fed-Communications eral Commission [FCC] ruling prompts phone companies to implement technologies that automatically block them. Dan Weber, an advocate for older Americans, says the ruling is a step in the right direction.

The president of the As-

ment hours after the FCC announced its decision. In it, the company stated that it is "putting robocallers on notice. We've got their number and we're taking big steps to stop them from doing what they're doing."

Meanwhile, Apple has announced a new software update will be available in the fall that can automatically block un-

Weber says, however, that he is taking a wait and see attitude regarding these latest efforts to rein in phone scammers. "It's a lucrative crime and the perpetrators are tech savvy enough to find new


ways to prey on the elder-

ly.' He cites an article on the FCC ruling published by Politico, which noted that: "experts warn that callers slinging bogus tax bills and insurance schemes might still find a way to get through. Calls originating from overseas could present a technical challenge. And the measures are voluntary: phone companies won't be required to take advantage of the call-blocking systems that the FCC is encouraging and could charge consumers fees for using them."

Tech journalist privacy advocate Paul Bischoff recently prepared an elder fraud analysis of phone scams targeting seniors for the technology research firm, CompariTech. The Bischoff report provides an eye-opening state-by-state assessment of elder fraud. He told AMAC that the FCC ruling to stop unwanted robocalls "is a step in the right direction but ultimately might not have the desired impact for consumers."

The report revealed that seniors are primary targets for fraudsters accounting for 38% of scams and that there are an estimated 5 million cases of elder fraud annually resulting in \$27.4 billion in losses.

"We are hopeful that the new focus on protecting the elderly from phone scammers will have a positive effect going forward. In the meantime, just hang up if a caller starts asking for personal information or makes threats. Don't take their word for it if they say they are calling on official business. No official will ever ask for you to reveal account numbers, Social Security numbers, Medicare id's over the phone."



Canisius Celebrates Sesquicentennial Anniversary

es. Beginning this summer, the campus will be branded with Sesquicentennial images and graphics. Sesquicentennial merchandise and apparel will be available in the Canisius Bookstore and online, and Canisius College: Celebrating 150 Years, a commemorative publication, will be completed in fall 2019.

High At Canisius School, the school year will begin with a picnic on campus to kick off the 150-year celebration. The Sesquicentennial theme will also be incorporated into the Canisius Athletic Hall of Fame induction ceremony in the fall, and several other events throughout the school year including the GAM-BIT XLVI dinner auction on March 21, 2020 and Alumni Weekend on June 19-20, 2020.

Also coinciding with the Sesquicentennial will be the release of Blue Doors: 150 Years of Jesuit Education at Canisius High School, 1870-2020, a book by Paul Cumbo **'**97.

Canisius College was founded by German Je-suits in 1870. Canisius officially opened its doors at 434 Ellicott Street on September 5, 1870, with an enrollment of 35 students in the combined high school and college which were originally housed and operated

as one institution. The ground floor of this bookstore was converted into a single large room for the Latin class and the upstairs rooms served the residential purposes of the Jesuit fathers. By the second academic year, enrollment had nearly doubled to 60 students and a new building became necessary. In 1872, work was completed on a three-story building at 651 Washington Street adjacent to St. Michael's Church built by the French Je-suits of Upper Canada in 1852. The high school was incorporated in 1883 by New York State as the Academic Department of Canisius College, and by September 1912 the high school served 379 boys.

With enrollment numbers climbing to more than 400, the dedication of the "New Canisius College" took place on December 30, 1912, and marked a new era in the history of the institution. The completion of the Old Main building at Main and Jefferson marked the permanent separation of the college and high school.

Today, Old Main is the symbol of Canisius College and its golden dome is one of Buffalo's most distinguished landmarks.

After 1912, the building on Washington Street was used exclusively by the high school, and Canisius High School graduated its first independent class in 1913. In 1944,

the Jesuits purchased the former Masonic Consistory, which included the former George F. Rand mansion, at 1180 Delaware Avenue. Between 1944 and 1948, the high school classes were split, with the upper school students still attending classes at the Washington Street site with the lower school classes at the new location on Delaware Avenue. After construction of a classroom wing, the entire student body was transferred to Delaware Avenue in 1948, which remains the location of the school today. The property holds much history. It served as barracks for troops during World War II, it was the one-time home of the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, and it's the site where President William McKinley died after being shot in 1901.






