

Restoration Complete



Historic landscaping is the final component of the two decades-long restoration effort at the Frank Lloyd Wright's Martin House.

Governor Andrew M. Cuomo has announced the completion of the restored Frank Lloyd Wright-designed landscape on the estate of the Darwin D. Martin House, the final component of the overall restoration effort that has spanned more than two decades and received more than \$50 million in investments in the National Historic Landmark and New York State Historic Site. The

Martin House received \$24 million in total funding from New York State beginning in 1993, and Governor Cuomo closed the gap with a \$5 million commitment. Those final funds were used primarily to rehabilitate the historic landscape, preserve the Barton House (1903) - the secondary residence on the estate - and complete the restoration of the second floor of the Martin House.

Wright's Martin House is an important example of the legendary designer's vision to create organic architecture that promotes harmony between the built environment and the natural world. At the Martin House estate, the multiple structures, extensive furnishings and decorative elements combine with the lavish landscape to create a unified, interrelated design composition. The historic

- Massachusetts Avenue Project Farmstand, 387 Massachusetts Avenue, Wednesday 4PM - 6PM
- North Buffalo Farmers Market, 780 Parkside Ave., Thursday 4:PM - 7PM
- Broadway Market 999 Broadway, Friday 9AM - 11:AM
- Downtown Country Farmers Market Main Street, Tuesday 10:AM - 12:PM

Sabres, Rodrigues Await Arbitration Outcome

On Tuesday the Buffalo Sabres and forward Evan Rodrigues attended an arbitration hearing in Toronto. Rodrigues chose to exercise his right to arbitration as he is seeking a raise from his 2018-19 salary of \$650,000. Rodrigues is primarily a bottom six forward with sufficient skill to fill in on a top six role when needed. He is seeking a one year deal at \$2.65 million. The Sabres are looking for a one year salary of \$1.5 million. The arbitrator has 48 hours to make his decision.

Arbitration awards are infrequent, with most cases settling beforehand. At the hearing the player, aided by his representative and the NHLPA, and the team, aided by their lawyers, each present their case for a certain salary level. The arbitrator may decide on any salary at or between those two points. Both sides will base their arguments on a theme centered around comparable players rather than debating the merits of the player.

Each side will use statistical ranges, both career and most recent season (platform year) numbers, to show how the player compares to similar players. All statistics

are available to use, but the persuasive argument is the key. The players side will look to show that the player is superior to a group of players at a lower salary, while the team will try to show that player is inferior to a group of players at a higher salary. Whoever makes the most convincing argument will earn a favorable decision.

Rodrigues can argue that he finished in the top six Sabres forwards in points and assists per game and total points and assists in his platform season. Also that he was fourth among Sabres forwards in average time on ice (ATOI) in his platform season and that he was fourth in total shots and shots per game. He is also a dependable player with

a regular role on the power play and penalty killing units and was third in face offs taken.

The Sabres can counter that Rodrigues is not a top six forward, that his offensive numbers do not match up with top six production around the league and that his role is a product of a talent thin Sabres roster. He is also outside of the top six Sabres forwards in power play ATOI and goal scoring with only nine goals due to an abnormally low shooting percentage. He also slipped from .52 points per game to .39 points per game in his platform season. He is not a goal scorer (only nine in his platform season), has a poor shooting percentage and poor faceoff stats.

Rodrigues has a pretty good chance in this case. His numbers may be the result of a top six role on a poor team that he will no longer have moving forward, but the Sabres can't make that argument in the hearing. The fact is that the team needed him in that capacity. A decision in Rodrigues favor can be expected with a salary around \$2.5 million.

landscape has now been fully realized with the placement of thousands of floral plantings, as well as trees, shrubs and vines, which artfully blur the lines between the buildings and the exterior spaces.

The historic landscape represents an important contributing feature to the overall significance of the 1.5-acre multi-residential city estate. Wright created homes in harmony with nature. He developed an integrated design approach unifying buildings, interior decorative elements and exterior landscape in an organic style, deriving inspiration from the natural world. The Martin House landscape plan combines formal aspects of the English Garden tradition and informal landscape elements. Wright arranged the Martin House plan to frame the trees and gardens beyond the walls and windows with each space open to views outside and artfully giving landscape features a presence within.

The restored landscape is a new source of education programs and interpretation for tours, community events and dialogues about the importance of nature and

A Night at the Movies

When I was a young lad many years ago, we had radio to listen to, but no television to watch. Our only way to see visual entertainment was a live play or the movies. Movies were so overwhelmingly popular with the public that there were movie theatres almost on every corner. Not quite, but you could find one within walking distance of your home. I had to walk two blocks to get to the "Senate" on West Avenue and Rhode Island. That was the closest in our immediate neighborhood. We could also walk to the Victoria Theatre on Ferry and Grant. Or across Grant on Ferry was the Rialto. It was a longer walk but still doable was the Elmwood on Elmwood and Utica. Or the Niagara on Niagara Street. A long walk would be to the Ellen Terry on Grant. We had an abun-

dant number of "Shows" as we used to call them. Not only was the admission inexpensive but our theatre used to give out dishes to movie goers. Each week they offered a different kind of dish to make up a set. My mother and dad went every week and got the complete set of dishes that we used for years. In addition to free dishes they had double features. That was two full length movies plus a weekly serial in between. Whatever it took to get viewers to return every week. The serial would always end with the hero or heroine in danger. You had to return the next week to see how they escaped certain death. Smoking was allowed in the "lodges." Section set aside for smokers. Ha, the theatre was soon full of smoke and the screen had a slight fog. The smoke did not stay

in the smoking section. Much like in today's theatres, besides admission, the concession stand is an added money maker. Have not been to a movie theatre in many years but last time I went, the price of popcorn was outrageous. When you have a standing room only crowd at the old theatres, you could bet the candy bars and drinks did very well. Standing room only was acceptable as if it was a good movie, you were willing to stand to see it. I mentioned that I have not been to a movie theatre in years. One reason is we used to exchange ads in the Rocket announcing the weeks movies in exchange for admission tickets. The Rocket would then give out free movie passes every week to its readers, like it does pizzas. New management stopped that deal. No more free passes. The other reason? One night, while we were at the theatre watching the movie "Troy", a group of rowdy teenagers were loud and boisterous in the theatre. When me and another fellow confronted them and asked

They then somehow were able to go out and kept turning on the lights, so you could not watch the movie. They came back into the theatre and again threatened me. I was in my seventies and there I stood face to face with a six-foot nasty kid challenging me. The manager came to stem the confrontation and we were able to watch the rest of the movie. We still had to leave the theatre and we knew they would be waiting outside for us. They did not disappoint, they were there, but fortunately so was a police cruiser with two of Buffalo's finest. We were happy to just get to our car and get out of there. That did a lot to make me reconsider ever attending at least that movie theatre. My son tells me that the new theaters have reclining seats and do much to add to the comfort of the watchers. Probably better security. Would hope so. I remember when television first came into being in a big way, they said it would be the death knoll for movies. Obviously, that did not happen. Movies are better than ever. However, after that incident, I prefer to wait till the new releases appear at the library and watch them at home. The popcorn is cheaper and the restrooms are closer. Ask Rusty - Collecting Spouse Benefits or Disability

Dear Rusty: My wife will be 62 in a few months and I'm still working (I am 59). Can my wife get any Social Security if I'm not yet retired? She's short quarters for her own Social Security from when she worked. She also worked under our State Teachers Retirement System as a substitute teacher, but she is short of getting any STRS benefits. She's a diabetic and has other health problems, so can she qualify for disability? Signed: Inquiring Husband

Dear Inquiring Husband: Your wife cannot collect Social Security spousal benefits from your record until you are collecting your own Social Security. To be eligible for Social Security on her own work record she needs to have at least 40 "quarters" of work credits – about 10 years of substantial earnings over her lifetime during which she and her employer both contributed to Social Security. Her employment with STRS didn't give her Social Security credits since her State employer doesn't participate in the Social Security program; however, if she doesn't have a STRS pension then neither does she need to worry about

that pension affecting her eventual Social Security spousal benefits when she can collect from you (if she had a pension from STRS her Social Security spousal benefit would be reduced).

As far as the possibility of your wife getting Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits, SSDI benefits can only be awarded based upon one's own work record. Whether your wife qualifies would depend upon how many Social Security quarter credits she has and when they were earned. Your wife would need to have worked in Social Security covered employment for at least 5 of the last 10 years to be eligible for SSDI benefits, and her current health condition would need to render her totally disabled and unable to work (and that must be medically confirmed) in order to qualify.

If she hasn't already done so, I suggest your wife obtain a Statement of Estimated Benefits and Earnings Statement from Social Security. She can do this online by setting up her own personal "My Social Security" account at www.ssa.gov or by requesting same from Social Security via phone.

You can find your local Social Security office contact information by going to this link: www.ssa.gov/locator. Once you have obtained this information you will be able to determine exactly how many Social Security "quarter credits" your wife actually has to this point and the employment years for which she earned them (for SSDI purposes), and also if she is entitled to any Social Security benefits on her own from credits earned over her lifetime (SS credits don't expire). Having all that information should help your wife fully understand if she has any claiming options other than waiting until you start collecting your own Social Security retirement benefit, at which point she can claim her spousal benefit.
