Wing Fest Returns



2019 edition of National Buffalo Chicken Wing Festival will be held at Sahlen Field starting on August 31st thru September 1st.

The National Buffalo Wing Festival, one of the country's most beloved food festivals, returns to Sahlen Field in Buffalo, New York on August 31st - September 1st to celebrate its 18th year. The festival attracted 50,000+ attendees from all 50 states and 36 different countries last

year. This year the National Buffalo Wing Festival will feature more than 25 local, regional, national, and international eateries, including 9 new eateries serving different regional sauces. Over 100 styles of chicken wings will be served as well as other festival favorite foods.

The National Buffalo Wing Festival has become a top destination for wing lovers from the world over since its 2002 *Continued on page six.*

811 Before You Dig

Before starting any excavation projects, call 811 – a toll-free national phone number – or visit digsafelynewyork. com to enter a single address ticket request. New York state law requires residents and contractors to do this at least two but no more than 10 business_days

in advance of the start of their projects in order to prevent a c c i d e n - tal damage to under-

ground utility lines. The national 811 phone number connects callers with local One Call Centers. Operators record the excavation locations and notify National Fuel of callers' plans. National Fuel then dispatches professional locators to mark the approximate locations of its lines. The online program allows

homeowners the freedom to create occasional location requests 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with no training requirements or hold time on the phone. As always, if you smell gas, leave fast! If a rotten-egg natural gas odor is present, leave the premises immedi-

ately and call National Fuel's emergency line, 1-800-444-3130, from a different loca-

tion. If you smell gas outdoors, call National Fuel's emergency number and provide the address nearest to the site of the odor. The Botanical Gardens and Gerard Place Collaborate

The Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens Society, Inc. installed a new outdoor Eco Garden in the spring of 2019. The Eco Garden fulfills part of the Botanical Gardens' current strategic plan that outlines diversifying their program of green initia-tives. With funding support from the Josephine Goodyear Foundation, PlantWNY, and private donors, the Eco Garden has come to fruition and now produces a large harvest of fresh vegetables and herbs that are donated to a local organization, Gerard Place.

The Eco Garden features a wide variety of vegetables and herbs, composting, vermiculture (an organic process of garden composting using worms), rain barrels and more. The garden is environmentally friendly and produces nutritional food, free of pesticides. Gerard Place provides housing for homeless single parents and their families and empowers those parents through education, employment, vocational training, life skills classes and counseling. Gerard Place has a huge need for fresh vegetables and herbs for the underserved population they assist on the East Side of Buffalo. Gerard Place is located in Bailey-Delevan neighborhood which is considered a food desert due to the absence of grocery stores within a five-mile radius. This results in a lack of healthy fruits and vegetables in this community which has very serious consequences with health and wellness in

this community. To date, 180 pounds of fresh vegetables and herbs have been donated to Gerard Place from the Eco Garden.

"The Botanical Gardens is thrilled to collaborate with Gerard Place for the first time. The Eco Garden is a project our team has been working on for over two years and it is exciting to see this important project and garden come together. Not only are we expanding important green initiatives at the Botanical Gardens, we also created a wonderful collaboration with Gerard Place and are helping to fill a need in our community." David Swarts, President/ CEO of the Buffalo Botanical Gardens.

"We are very excited to partner with the Botanical Gardens to help ensure that families that come to our site will have the opportunity to take home healthy options for their meals. In addition to this initiative, we will implement health and nutrition classes for the community using this food and showing people how to cook, clean and

store the fruits and vegetables. The food will be used in our dining hall which helps to feed people dinner, in our monthly food express line with our partnership with the Food Bank and we will offer the food to our Children's Academy parents who live in this community where food insecurity is their primary concern. We are so grateful to our community partners like the Botanical Gardens who will help us address this very serious issue." David Zapfel, President/ CEO of Gerard Place.



Radio, back when.

When I was a young lad growing up, like most kids, I had a lot to learn. Our house on 14th street had a telephone with an outside wire connected to the nearest "telephone pole". They were called "telephone poles" even though they also carried electric wire. The pole was one of the many going in every direction. It seemed natural to assume that you needed this wire to carry the voice from one phone to another. The wire was the connector. We also had a radio. Beautiful Mission oak floor model with a large round dial at the top for tuning. A nice-looking piece of furniture. It was our entertainment center every night. We would all huddle under a blanket and listen to our favorite nighttime serials or stories. "The Shadow"

"Inner Sanctum", Fibber Magee and Molly, Amos and Andy, to name a few. The radio had a cord that plugged into the wall, so it was only natural to assume the voices we heard were coming through the wire from the plug. Somehow that plug was connected to the radio station, I thought. If you unplugged it, the radio went off.

Our radio was on all day. We would listen to children's programs in the morning with cereal ads and jingles. "Cream of Wheat is so good to eat", "He's feeling his Cheerios", "Wheaties, the breakfast of Champions", Mothers Oats, and Corn Flakes were the major brands back then. In the afternoon it was Soap Operas, "Lorenzo Jones and his wife Bell", The edge of night and others all afternoon.

Since most women at that time were housewives and afternoon listeners the ads were geared for household items. Soaps like "Oxydol", stains run from 101, "Ivory soap, it floats" and Fels Naptha. Think that's why they called them soap operas. At night the intense dramas would encourage cigarette ads. Lucky Strikes means fine tobacco, I'd walk a mile for a Camel, Pall Mall, and others dominated the air waves. The only sports on the radio were baseball

and boxing.
Seldom was
there music and
the only news was
if there was a big
event. "We interrupt this broadcast
to bring you this up
to date news". It
had to be major because if you wanted
to know the news,
you read the morning Courier Expres

ing Courier Express or the Buffalo Evening News newspapers. If you wanted to hear music, you listened to your 33-record player or wind up Victrola. The radio was mostly for story telling or breaking news only. Slowly things started to change. World war II came, and you wanted to know the news as it was happening, not the next day in the paper. Newscast became more popular and so did radio music.

Then I was shocked. Remember I said that I thought you needed to plug it into the wall like you did a telephone to get reception? They came out with a radio that needed no plug. It was called a portable radio. About the

the radio station without being plugged in or any wires? This boggled my young mind.

I had to find out how a radio worked. Had to read up on it. Found out that the air is filled with radio waves that you cannot see or feel but are there. The radio station sends out invisible signals to the immediate area. The radio receiver must have an "antenna" to collect these signals and send them to the radio. No wires need-



instant news, music, stories and lots of information. Plus, lots of advertisement. Radio was king, at least for a while. Until a thing called television came along. That will be next week's column




Antique portable radio.

Ask Rusty - Paying Income Taxes on Social Security Benefits Dear Rusty: I under- your "combined income,"

Dear Rusty: I understand that after I reach full retirement age, I no longer have a limit on how much I earn. I retired one year early (65), and am now 76, but I am still being taxed on a portion of my SS benefits. I am not working and making extra money.

However, my wife is still working, and I get two small annuities per month. But when I file income tax I am told we made enough for me to be taxed on a portion of my Social Security benefit. I even checked to see if filing married but separate returns would help and it was not as good as joint returns. So maybe you can explain this to me. Signed: Taxpaying Senior

Dear Taxpaying Senior: I'm afraid you're speaking of two different things. You are correct that once you reach your full retirement age there is no longer a limit on how much you can earn from working before your monthly Social Security benefit is reduced. But that is something totally different from paying income tax on your Social Security benefits.

Social Security's "earnings limit" looks only at your earnings from employment (or self-employment) to decide if they should take back some of your benefits before you reach your full retirement age. However, whether or not your Social Security benefits are taxable income is determined by

which includes your adjusted gross income as reported to the IRS, plus any non-taxable interest you may have had, plus 50% of your total Social Security benefits for the tax year. This is often referred to as your "modified adjusted gross income" or "MAGI" and it's how the IRS determines if, or how much of your Social Security benefit is taxable income. As a couple filing your income taxes as "married - filing jointly" if your MAGI is over \$32,000 then up to 50% of your annual Social Security benefit amount is taxable, and if your MAGI is over \$44,000 then up to 85% of your Social Security income becomes taxable. Note that the combined income levels are different, and lower, when you file your taxes individually.

The "earnings limit" is a rule imposed by Social Security to recover some benefits paid if the limit is exceeded due to your earnings from working. Taxation of Social Security benefits is done by the IRS (not Social Security) and it's the IRS who determines if your Social Security benefits will add to your income tax burden. And while the Social Security earnings limit goes away once you reach your full retirement age, there is no such relief from the IRS at any age when it comes to paying income tax on your Social Security benefits.

Erie County Free Rabies Vaccination Clinics

"Our department vaccinated 2,145 animals in four clinics already this year," said Erie Čounty Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein. "Our goal is to have 100% of dogs, cats and ferrets vaccinated in Erie County to protect against this 100% fatal disease." A rabies vaccination is required by law for dogs, indoor and outdoor cats and ferrets four months of age and older.

Dr. Burstein continued, "We see cases where a pet owner thinks that because their animal never goes outside, they don't need a rabies vaccine. But bats can find their way into homes, and any animal can escape a house."

In 2019 so far, the Erie County Department of Health has confirmed 13

cases of rabies in wild animals through testing with the New York State Department of Health. Any warm-blooded mammal can carry and transmit rabies through saliva, bodily fluids and brain tissue. "The most important message we can give to Erie County residents is to leave wild animals alone," said Senior Public Health Sanitarian Peter Tripi. "Call animal control or the police to handle aggressive wild animals, and never take in wildlife as possible pets. Call a licensed wildlife rehabilitator for advice if you see abandoned young animals, and call a licensed wildlife control officer to handle nuisance animals on your property.'

Checklist for Clinics:

• Bring your pet on a secure collar/harness and leash, or in a pet carrier.

• Avoid using retractable or extended leashes.

• Bring a copy of your pet's vaccination record, if possible.


