# Taste Of Buffalo Admission Tickets Go On Sale June 11



Taste of Buffalo returns for July 2021.

Admission tickets for all four sessions of the 38th annual Taste of Buffalo presented by Tops, which will be held July 10 and 11, will go on sale June 11.

Admission tickets will cost \$20 and will include food and beverage tickets. Admission tickets must be purchased in advance and no admission tickets will be sold at the festival. Children 3 years of age and younger will be free. Admission tickets are limited one-year-only paid admission policy, which is part of the Taste's COVID-19 health and safety plan to control the size of the crowd.

Tops Friendly Markets, Taste of Buffalo's longtime presenting sponsor, will offer a special bonus ticket deal for the Tops Markets Session on Saturday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. The cost of admission to the Tops Markets Session will be \$20 and includes \$15 in food and beverage tickets, a \$5 bonus. Tickets for the Tops Markets Session are only available at the registers at Tops stores.

Admission tickets will be sold online for the other three sessions – 4:30 to 8:30 p.m. Saturday; 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Sunday; and 3:30 to 7:30 p.m. Sunday. The \$20 ticket admits one and includes \$10 in food and

beverage tickets. Guests should visit TasteofBuffalo. com on June 11 for a link to purchase tickets. For the first time ever, guests will have the option to purchase additional food tickets online at the time they purchase their admission ticket. A minimum of one admission ticket must be purchased in order to purchase additional food tickets online. Guests will receive their food tickets when redeeming their admission ticket at the gate. Guests will also have the opportunity to purchase additional food tickets at the ticket tent inside the festival during all four ses-

To make entry into the festival smooth, each ticket purchased will inform guests which of three gates they should enter. Gate A will be located on Delaware Avenue at Huron Street; Gate B will be located at Court Street and Franklin Street and Gate C will be located at Delaware Ave-Continued on page six.

# The Blotter Felonies

From "D" District

### North Buffalo June 6, 2021

Delaware at Amherst Streets Victim reports that while at Delaware and Amherst in Buffalo, she gave a male known only by the name of Patrick custody of her vehicle and is now intentionally retaining the vehicle. # Ask Rusty – Will My UK Pension Affect My US Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I am 57 years old, was born in the UK, and since 1988 have worked in the US. I have always paid US taxes and Social Security. For the last 20 years, my annual income has typically been well north of \$100K. In recent years I have made voluntary payments to the UK National Insurance system looking to claim a retirement benefit from the UK as well as from the US. My concern is that if I claim the UK benefit, this will affect my US Social Security claim. Any insight you can share will be appreciated. Signed: Worried

Dear Worried: If you have 30 or more years of U.S. employment where you paid into Social Security via payroll taxes on "substantial" earnings, your U.K. pension will not affect your U.S. Social Security benefit when you claim it. Social Security's definition of "substantial" earnings is different for each year but, generally, if you worked full time in the U.S. and paid into Social Security via payroll taxes since 1988, the so-called Wind-

fall Elimination Provision (WEP) won't affect your US Social Security benefits.

Here is a link to Social Security's WEP definition which includes a table of "substantial" earnings needed to count for WEP www.ssa.gov/ purposes: pubs/EN-05-10045.pdf. The document at this link also describes how WEP works if you have less than 30 years of substantial U.S. earnings. With less than 30 years of substantial earnings on which you paid into Social Security your U.S. benefit will be reduced due to your U.K. pension. The amount of reduction would depend upon how many years of substantial SS-covered earnings you have, but in no case can the reduction be more than 50% of your U.K. pension.

If needed, you can get

your Earnings Statement from Social Security, which will show your actual taxable SS earnings for each year to compare against the WEP substantial earnings chart found at the above link. The easiest way to get your Earnings Statement is via your "My Social Security" online account. If you haven't yet set up your personal online account with SS, you can easily do so at this link: www.ssa. gov/myaccount.

So, the bottom line is this: If you have contributed to U.S. Social Security from "substantial" earnings for at least 30 years, your Social Security benefit will not be affected by your U.K. pension; if you have less than 30 years of contributions to SS, it will. As you may know, you cannot collect your U.S. Social Security until you are at least age 62, but if you claim at that age your benefit amount will be reduced by 30%. You'll reach your full retirement age at age 67, and that is the point at which you will get 100% of what you've earned by working in the U.S. - subject to WEP reduction only if you have less than 30 years of contributions to Social Security.



# **Help Wanted!**

What a strange time we are going through. Everywhere you go you see "help wanted" or "now hiring" signs more than stop signs. Wondering if that is a good thing. I know it is good that there is plenty of work around for all those who are looking to be employed. I have lived through the bad years when trying to find any type of job was impossible.

Born during the late depression era there is no question that work of any kind was hard to find. My dad was able to keep his job and feed his eight children. It was not that easy for others. Not that it was easy for us. Many would spend the day going from place to place and anywhere with the hopes of getting at least one day's wages. There were lots of hungry people who lived day by day. We struggled as even though my dad was working, the wages were

far from adequate.

Then World War II came and as we know in those years there was more work than workers. All the manufacturing factories were turned into defense plants. The young men of the country were drafted and taken out of the local workforce. Still people were needed to produce what was necessary to win the war. As we learned, women filled the bill and became the backbone of the assembly lines. "Rosie the Riveter" became famous and with the women of America's contribution, we won the war. Help wanted signs during those years were also a quite common sight.

Then the war ended. Not only did the defense plants lose their biggest customer, the government, but all those thousands of men and women who were overseas returned home. Soon all the jobs that were available again became full and we again had unemployment. Finding employment became difficult for any unskilled person. That did not last that long as we were soon engaged into another conflict, the Korean War. Men and women went overseas, and the factories had defense contracts again. That did not last that long. Three years.

As before, when it was over, the troops returned home, and the government contracts dried up. This was the late 50's. The recovery was not swift. Long lines at the unemployment benefit building and again you would not see a help wanted sign anywhere. I speak from experience as I went through those years desperate for any kind of work. I did anything to help feed my new family. Home building was one of the biggest booming industries at the time as the baby boomers were looking for housing.

If you are hungry, you do almost anything to get a paycheck. They needed carpenters badly so I told them I was a carpenter. I really was not. I lasted a couple of days until they told me to build a staircase going to the basement. That did it. I was exposed as a fraud. Made a few bucks anyway but still had

no job. I had to move in with my parents as I had no place to go. Back then to collect unemployment you had to have worked at a place for six months I believe. That was not an op-

So, every day I would seek any kind of work as I had no known skills. One day I was determined to find a job. I was going to go door to door and inquire. My decision was to start on Niagara Street as it was with the most factories within walking distance. Started at the very first place downtown and went into every building with dozens of no answers. Finally at 1200 Niagara, Moore Business Forms, hope. At first it was a definite no, but after talking to the head man, and again being untruthful, (told him I was a bookkeeper) I was hired to a full-time day job. Alleluia brother. Never had to do any bookkeeping as that person returned. They kept me anyway cause I was handsome.

After experiencing such times in my life, I look now at the situation here. Workers are needed to fill the simplest of jobs. Restaurants have cut their hours as they lack staff. Some had to close. This is not like the war years when no

able body personnel were available. Plenty of people still on unemployment but yet the need is there for workers. I see McDonalds starting at \$15 an hour. A restaurant owner in California said he would pay a dishwasher \$20 an hour. It is great that we need workers, and the jobs are there, what we need now is people who want to work.


