City Of Buffalo 2024 Spring Bulk Trash Collection Schedule

Mayor Byron W. Brown and the City of Buffalo Department of Public Works, Parks & Streets announced today another new season of Spring Bulk Trash Collection starting in April.

There is NO Bulk Trash Pickup the week of April 7th. Bulk Trash Collection in the Ellicott Council District has been moved from the week of Sunday, April 7th to the week of Sunday, June 30th. The 2024 Spring Bulk Trash Collec-

tion season in Buffalo will now begin in the Fillmore Council District the week of Sunday, April 14th.

"We're pleased to announce a new year of bulk trash collection in Buffalo, which kicks off in early April in the Ellicott District. I ask City residents to follow the guidelines on the amount and type of items that can be put out for collection," said Mayor Brown. "I also ask residents to get their bulk trash to the curb on the Sunday of their design-

ated collection week as pick-ups will take place Monday through Saturday, not just on their scheduled garbage day."

Residents are asked to follow the posted parking regulations in their neighborhood to make sure trash collection equipment has access to the curbside piles. The 2024 Spring Bulk Trash Collection Schedule is as follows.

"It's crunch time!" That's the message from Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League president John Hornung to his coaches Monday night at Shoshone Park.

At the latest of weekly meetings for the 67 year old Baseball and Softball youth sports program, Hornung was giving updates on everything from the status of the new Thomas M. Smith Athletic Center building, registration numbers, amount of teams formed for all children and the handing out of equipment for all those teams. All the team uniforms for house and travel have been ordered and soon all the businesses that sponsored this season will be placed on the backs of each jersey.

With just 20 days left until Opening Day Saturday May 4th, the boys and girls are all looking forward to playing in Shoshone Park in front of all their friends and families. They're hoping for sunny and warm days ahead, especially on the first day, when as many as 18 games can be played over several hours after an annual parade up Hertel Avenue from Saranac around 11:00 am in front of storefronts, restaurants and St. Margaret's Church along the way.

This Saturday, the League will be at Shoshone early along with members of St. Marks Church and several other local organizations, volunteering to help beautify the tiny Park. Their jobs would include raking and collecting leaves and picking up unnecessary garbage around the dia-

monds, including sticks and tree limbs after winter months. If you wish to help in any way, please help with trash bags and your garden tools from home. The event begins promptly at 9:00 am and can be completed in just a few hours.

There still are openings in several divisions for new children to register to sign up for this season, but time is of the essence. Go to www.hnpybl.com and click on the registration tab and you will be led to filing your necessary information to our website. There are plenty of teams in all age brackets and your son or daughter can be on a team this Summer.

Practice schedules for all teams prior to Opening Day have been planned beginning on Thursday, April 18 and continuing nightly and on the weekends under the direction of the volunteer coaches who have agreed to help boys and girls learn the game and improve their skills. Most house team coaches have been a part of this League for several years and several return after their own children have left the Park.

Every child gets a chance to play throughout the season. No child sits on the bench in a dugout for an entire game. There are Park rules that are handed out prior to the season and all coaches must read and understand these rules before game time.

Games are scheduled every night during the week, Monday through Friday at 6:00pm and on Saturday from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm. They are six inning games for both the boys and the girls and every effort is made to complete a house game in just under two hours.

On Saturdays, beginning at 9:30 am, as many as six or seven games can be played all at one time on as many diamonds all within reach of each other across the entire Park. There are eight playable diamonds in Shoshone Park, including t-ball and if a game is scheduled on diamond #1 at 9:30 am, then three more games can be played there later on that same day, at 11:30, 1:30 and 3:30 pm provided the six inning games can be completed in just under two hours. It is an amazing day for everyone involved.

Early Monday afternoon, several Hertel North Park families arrived to hopefully get a chance to watch this once in a lifetime event in a place where they have been going to for years already. Where better than Shoshone Park, where they've pitched and hit baseballs since t-ball every Summer.

"I think it's pretty cool," said Jack Ramsey, an eight year old Yankee from last season. "Just being here and having fun."

"It's better than I thought it would be," said Leopold Scott, "pretty awesome."

Naveen Ladori, a 10 year old Mariner from last season was also very impressed. "We have a big part of this solar eclipse."

These three joined Gavin Ramsey, Vince Ladori, Oliver Scott, Patrick Gaughan and Linus Ward and practiced hitting and fielding around Diamond 7. Everyone wore their protective glasses when the time came and watched darkness fall over Shoshone Park.



Ask Rusty – Can I Claim Social Security And Still Work?

Dear Rusty: I will be turning 63 soon. Can I apply for Social Security and continue to work? Would I be limited to how many hours or how much I could make? I know my monthly SS amount would be cut by 30%, or somewhere around there, but how would working affect me? I was trying to read up on this, but the \$1 and \$2 thing confused me. I have an offer to take a work-at-home position and need to decide soon, but it is a cut in income. The cut would be okay if I could draw my Social Security too.

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Signed: Wanting Work at Home

Dear Wanting: If you claim your Social Security to start in the month you turn 63, you'll be claiming 4 years before your full retirement age (FRA) of 67, which means your monthly benefit at 63 will be about 25% less than it would be if you claimed SS at age 67. And if you are working before your FRA, you'll be subject to Social Security's "earnings test."

The 2024 earnings limit for those collecting early Social Security benefits is \$22,320 (this limit changes annually). If your annual earnings exceed the limit, Social Security will assess a penalty of \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. They will recover that penalty amount by with-

holding future benefits until they recover what you owe. If your work earnings are under the annual limit, you will get all your monthly SS benefits. But if you exceed the limit, they will find that out after you submit your income tax return (the following year) and issue you an overpayment notice, telling you how much you owe for exceeding the limit last year. They will then withhold your benefits until they get back what you owe, or you can repay them in a lump sum. To avoid the overpayment notice, it is best to inform Social Security in advance that you will exceed the annual earnings limit, and they will simply withhold your monthly SS benefits during the year for enough months to avoid overpaying you.

So, what you should do depends largely on how much your earnings from your new work-at-home position will be. If your earnings are below the annual limit, no penalty will be assessed. If you only exceed the annual limit by a little bit, then you can still work and earn and simply repay them what is owed for exceeding the limit (or have your SS benefit temporarily withheld). If you only exceed the earnings limit by a little, you'll still get benefits for most months of the year. But if you significantly exceed the annual earnings limit, you could even be ineligible to receive SS benefits until

you either earn less or reach your full retirement age (the earnings limit goes away at your FRA).

So, what you should do depends on what "a cut in income" means in terms of your expected annual earnings amount. If your total annual earnings will be under the annual limit, your SS benefit won't be affected. If you only exceed the limit by a little bit, then you will get SS benefits for most months of the year. But if your annual earnings are significantly over each year's annual earnings limit, then you won't get SS benefits for most months of the year and may even be temporarily ineligible to receive benefits.

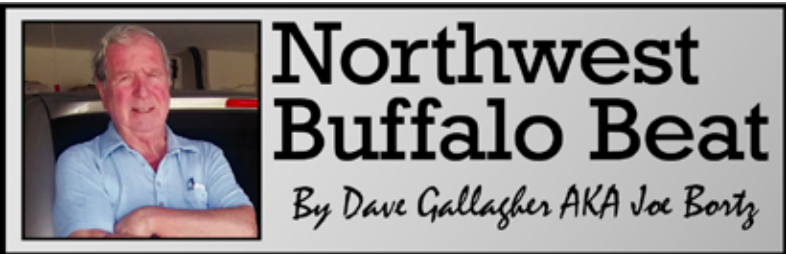


Table For Ten, Please.

Years ago, my good friend, Dominic Gregorio, came to my house to bring me a bottle of his home-made wine. He and his friend, and mine, Peter Costanzo, who also was my accountant at the time, used to make their own wine every year. Dominic would always bring me a couple of bottles at Christmas time. Back then, there was a substantial number of my Italian friends who used to have wine making equipment in their basements. Just like spaghetti on Sunday it was an Italian tradition. They could not wait for the season when the grapes were ready. Not being a wine connoisseur, to me, they all tasted the same. It was free, so I partook in it.

It was Christmas day when Dominic came over and we had just sat down for Christmas dinner. I will never forget what he said. He saw all my family, ten of us, sitting at the table and he said, "Sorry, I did not know you had company." Company? "Dom-

inic, this is just my family." He knew I had eight kids, but I guess the sight of seeing us all together at the table like that was unique. Seeing any table with ten people one would think it was some sort of gathering. It was our supper table every night for years. Once a year we went to Casa Da Pizza on Elmwood. People thought it was some kind of party. No, just us having dinner.

What is that like feeding ten people every day? Looking back, it was fun and a lot of work. My wife of course did the cooking, but everyone had a chore. One peeled the five-pound bag of potatoes, we used to peel them by hand back then. One set the table, one cleared after dinner, one washed the dishes, one dried, one put the dishes away. The two youngest were watchers. My oldest daughter was the dishwasher. The five boys were all big eaters, all grew to be over six feet tall, so we needed plenty of food. Somehow, we always managed. The older

boys liked to clear as they got whatever leftovers were there from the girls. No one complained, knew their job, and just did their thing.

My oldest daughter was an usher at Kleinhans Music Hall and had seen the musical, "Jesus Christ Superstar" so many times she knew all the songs. After dinner, during the cleanup, she taught the other siblings the words and each night they got better at singing the various parts of the play. They were good and I used to enjoy listening to them as I read the paper. I, of course, did nothing except provide the food we ate. Pasta in different forms, mashed potatoes and chuck steak, hamburger, or hot dogs. Baloney and peanut butter jelly sandwiches. Whatever was affordable.

Recently one of my granddaughters asked one of my sons what it was like to be poor. His answer was great to me. He said, "We never felt like we were poor." We had a house to live in, a bed to sleep in, always had food on the table and never went hungry, and best of all, we had each other. We were happy. Growing up, he said, he never felt we were poor in any way. I could go on and on about those days. Only glad they happened and happy, I have these fond memories to look back on. Only wish I could relive them.
