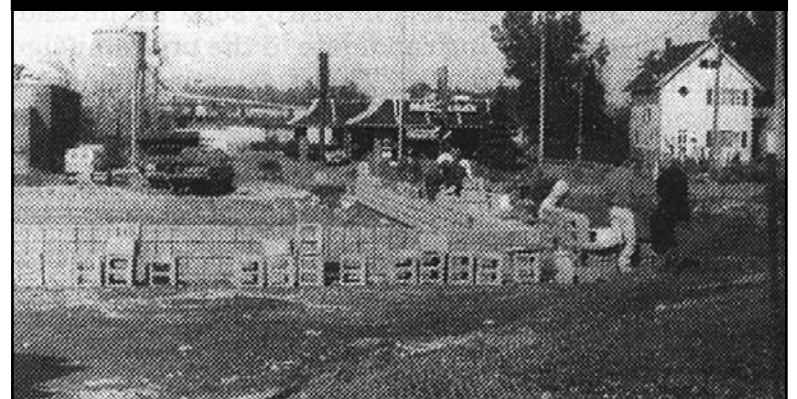

Hall Of Fame Play In Cooperstown!

"We finished 7-2 in Cooperstown," wrote Hertel North Park League president John Hornung late last Saturday, August 17 to the League website. "Love all of them as if they were my own. I will miss managing them immensely. Good luck to all of them in the future."

As president of North Buffalo Baseball and Softball, Hornung has had a very trying year in 2024 as the leader of this successful youth organization that has served North Buffalo since 1957. While an architect formulated plans and a Construction crew began to dig a foundation for a new building in Shoshone Park to be used year round in 2025, Hornung dealt with parking issues for a League that numbered well over 1,200 boys and girls and was a member of numerous meetings held with the City to make sure things were on track for the future while preparing for Opening Day.

But no one expected what happened two weeks ago in Cooperstown, NY, the heart of Major League Baseball in this Country when a 12U North Buffalo Blaze team visited All Star Village and came away with some awesome victories in the Sweet Sixteen against some of the best talent for the game that you'll ever see up close and just 70 feet away.

Hornung and three other coaches, Corey Gordon,

Randy Hadden and Matthew Ward led a dozen boys from Hertel North Park into the annual Cooperstown Tournament held every year near Oneonta College and put North Buffalo on the map of places that opponents need to fear in the future. The success the team had this season in their own Travel Schedule was transformed onto the playing diamonds of Cal Ripken Park in a marathon of games played over four days from August 13-18 in front of thousands of fans and of course, family members who made the trip.

"As a coach, as a board member and just as a parent, it was just an amazing opportunity to watch my son, Linus participate in this great Tournament against teams from New York, New Jersey, Long Island and Massachusetts," said Matt Ward Monday night. "Everyone played well for us, the whole team just brought their A Game to the Diamonds and I couldn't be more proud of them."

The Blaze finished with a 5-1 record in pool play once the Tournament began and became the 17th ranked team of as many as 73 teams that had traveled to Cooperstown this particular week. Greyson Gordon pitched a complete game shutout, 17-0 win in game one, played Tuesday August

13th against the East Coast Ghost. The team scored nine runs in the third Inning. RBI singles by Eamon Smith and Jayden Horan put North Buffalo on the board before Paul Rubino homered to centerfield that scored two more runs and the Blaze were on their way to a first victory.

Jayden Horan pitched a complete game one hitter in game two, an 11-1 victory over Energy Baseball later the same day. The Blaze scored six runs on six hits in the bottom of the second Inning. Carter Horan and Rubino both singled that scored one run. Jayden Horan and Smith both doubled that brought in three runs. Linus Ward went two for three at the plate.

John R Hornung pitched a complete game one hitter for the Blaze the next day, Wednesday, an 18-3 victory over the Lynbrook Knights led by teammate Bengy Hadden who blasted two homeruns, with five RBI's. Paul Rubino allowed only three hits and just one run in game four. Hornung and Ward were masterful with a ball as each pitch by Hornung found the strike zone and Ward's glove resulted in numerous strikeouts. Burke Ganci pitched great in relief for the Blaze but contributed mightily, leading the team in homeruns with five. Eamon Smith, who had earlier won a skills competition for speed on Opening Day of the Tournament, led the team with 16 hits overall, 14 RBI's and 15 runs scored.

Individual accolades for the team are too many to grasp all at one time. Carter Horan hit .526. Bengy Hadden .524 and Vinny Majchrzak .400 over the nine game span. Joe Constantine led the team defensively on the diamond. As an infielder, he made a diving catch into right field that ended an inning.

This was the second year in a row where Hertel North Park sent two teams to Cooperstown. Corey Sloan coached Ricardo Castro, William Conrad, Michael Curry, Michael Eberz, Cole Glenn, Henry Janowski, Vincent Ladori, Jack Lester, Nolan Mancuso, Drew Smith and William Tooley. Another player, Hudson Martin, was unable to make the trip. Congratulations to both teams.



For Advice on When to Claim Social Security – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I could use some advice on whether or not I should start collecting my Social Security benefits now. I am 67 and 3 months old, and plan to continue working for at least for the next year or two.

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Signed: Seeking Answers

Dear Seeking: Deciding when to claim Social Security is, indeed, an important decision, as it will affect you for the rest of your life. Mainly, deciding when to claim your SS retirement benefit should consider your financial needs, but your life expectancy and marital status are equally important.

At your current age (past your full retirement age of 66 years & six months) you are already earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) at the rate of .677% higher benefit for each month you continue to delay. That adds up to an additional 8% benefit for each full year you wait beyond your FRA to claim, and that growth will continue until you are 70 years old. At that point, your benefit will be 28% higher than it would have been at your full retirement age (FRA). If you expect to achieve about “average” life expectancy (about 84 for a man your current age), then waiting until 70 to claim will get you both a higher monthly amount and the

most you can get in cumulative lifetime benefits. Waiting, however, only makes sense if you expect at least average longevity. If your health is poor and you have reason to believe you won't live to the “average,” then claiming earlier makes more sense. FYI, you may find this tool helpful to determine your potential life expectancy: <https://socialsecurityreport.org/tools/life-expectancy-calculator/>

You can, of course, simply delay claiming for as long as you are still working, and then file for benefits at that time. When your paychecks stop is frequently the best time to start your SS benefits (to supplement the lost work income). And, if you are married and your wife will be entitled to a survivor benefit from you, then waiting longer to claim enhances the benefit your surviving spouse receives

at your death (your surviving spouse would get your benefit amount, instead of her own smaller amount). If that is a consideration, then waiting – at least until you stop working (or age 70 if feasible) is often a prudent choice.

Reinstein Woods To Hold Annual Fall Festival Sept. 21st

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) today announced the 24th annual Fall Festival at Reinstein Woods Nature Preserve in Cheektowaga on Saturday, Sept. 21, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Visitors can

spend the day enjoying nature-based activities, exhibits, guided walks, live animals, and more. The festival is free and open to the public.

DEC Reinstein Woods Center Director Meaghan Boice-Green said, "With almost 300 acres of forest

and wetlands starting to change colors, Reinstein Woods is the perfect place to celebrate the start of the fall season."

During the event, visitors can experience the forest on guided walks led by a New York State Forester and Western New York PRISM or join a scavenger hunt

to find some of the more than 20 nature and environmental organizations at the festival, including Penn Dixie Fossil Park, WNY Young Birder Club, Erie County Soil and Water Conservation District, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Those attending this year's festival can practice wildlife observation skills at the Wildlife Spotters Challenge and visit with Buffalo Audubon Society's ambassador screech owl. Kids of all ages can become scientists through interactive activities at the Pond Exploration Zone and Science Zone, while also enjoying crafts, face painting, and costumed

forest characters. Smokey Bear will also make a special appearance.

Special presentations will be held throughout the day, including a demonstration by DEC Forest Rangers and music by the Buffalo Ukelele Club. Festivalgoers can also enjoy dining on treats available for purchase at the Boy Scout Troop 500 food stand.

Visitors are encouraged to "green their transportation" by riding the Parks Adventure Bus to the Festival. The bus will arrive at the festival throughout the day. More details can be found on the NFTA website.

The event is free but donations to Friends of Reinstein Woods are appreciated at the door to support the festival.
