

Buffalo School Buses now have cameras that record when a car passes a stopped School Bus.



Twelve boys wearing blue and white jersey's that said Kansas City across their chests, celebrated royally after their team, the Royals, won the Championship in the Green Division of Rookie Boys this Summer in Shoshone

Park. The Royals defeated the Red Sox 10-8 in the seven team Double Elimination Playoffs held in late July following two very exciting games that could have gone ei-

ther way. Both 6U teams were so evenly matched that both sides agreed, could have gone either way. Winning team manager Charles Trottier led the Royals to a 10-1-1 record during the regular season, good for the second cede in the House Division Playoffs. With an even mix of first and second year players, Trottier watched the boys become great models to the younger players this season. "We lost to the Red Sox, 10-9, in the last inning of the first Championship in a very emotional game and the kids thought it was over," he said. "But then I told them we were in the winners bracket and we still had a chance."

The Red Sox were the comeback story of the Rookie Boys Division this season. They got off to a slow start in May, losing three of their first five games but they turned eir season around

their season around just before the Playoffs and beat the A's, 7-4 in Round One.

Roman Dwyer of the Royals blasted a three run homerun in the top of the sixth to put Kansas City up by three heading into the bottom half of the Inning. Dwyer, a staple for the Royals all season long, got help from teammates defensively to shut down the Sox.

With two outs, the Red Sox loaded the bases after scoring a run before pitcher Declan McCabe knocked down a ball hit right back to him and threw a strike to first baseman Liam Roehl to make the catch for the third and final out of the 6th and the Championship victory was theirs.

Unfortunately, one Royals player wasn't a part of the final game. Byron Smith, a leader all season long for the Royals, is the team's leadoff hitter and could be counted on to lead the Kansas City attack. Smith was stellar on the diamond as well, making several putouts during the year, catching line drives or pop ups off an opponent's bat.

"We missed Byron Smith for the last game," said Trottier afterward, "so the boys and I decided to dedicate the game in his honor and I think their emotions came through royally"

Players on the team include Hudson Cournyea, Hugo Derringer, Hendrix Garcia, Finn McGowan, Ben Reimann, Kealan Sinnott, Emmett Trottier and Drew Wilson.

"I'm very happy and proud of these boys," said Trottier afterward. "They hung in there and played well every game. You can't ask for anything better than that.





Husband Upset about His Wife's Survivor Benefit – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: This is a matter that I find particularly irksome. My wife – a retired teacher - was told that, should I pre-decease her, she is not eligible to get survivor benefits from my Social Security payments. I'm sure there is some bureaucratic arcane. justification for this, but I think it unconscionable. Is this true and if so, what sort of major miracle would be required to alter that?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Signed: Disgruntled in Texas. Dear Disgruntled: If your wife was a teacher in a school district (which includes all Texas school districts)

that exempted her from paying into Social Security, then any Social Security surviving spouse benefit she becomes entitled to from you will be affected by a provision called the Government Pension Offset (GPO). The GPO will reduce her Social Security survivor benefit by two-thirds (67%) of the amount of her (non-covered) teacher's pension, which can (and often does) eliminate her surviving spouse benefit. The GPO affects teachers in about 15 states who have opted not to participate in So-

cial Security. For information, this is similar to what happens to a spouse who has also earned a Social Se-

curity retirement benefit - their survivor benefit is offset by their Social Security retirement benefit, and only the excess (if any) is paid. The GPO is actually a bit more generous, in that your wife's survivor benefit is only offset by 2/3rds of her non-covered teacher's pension, whereas the offset is 100% for other surviving spouses who have earned SS retirement benefits as well. This is a provision that has been law since 1977, affecting all those who have a pension earned without contributing to Social Security. Its premise was to better equalize the way SS benefits are paid to everyone.

How can that be altered? Well, the only way is by Congress changing Social Security law. There have been numerous attempts to change the GPO law over the years, none of which have been successful. Indeed, there is a proposed law – H.R. 82 – The Social Security Fairness Act - which was introduced in Congress last year. That proposal, to eliminate the GPO (and a sister provision called the Windfall Elimination Provision), has essentially made little Congressional progress, short of a few committee hearings, and the outlook for passage at this point is about zero.

I'm afraid I can't be optimistic that the GPO will be repealed, as Congress is more keenly focused on resolving Social Security's looming solvency issue, set to come to a head in less than a decade.

Continued from page one. about the safety initiative are now located at Delaware and Hertel Parkside and Linden and Main Street and Delavan.

With the new Buffalo Public Schools academic year to begin on Thursday, September 5th, Mayor Byron W. Brown and the City of Buffalo, along with Buffalo Public Schools and BusPatrol, issued another reminder to motorists to not pass a stopped school bus in the City of Buffalo. Digital message boards were recently moved to a few new locations this past week in a continued effort to remind residents and motorists about this added precaution to keep students safe while traveling to and from school. The new locations for the digital message boards are Delaware and Hertel, Parkside and Linden and Main Street and Delavan.

"Driving passed a stopped school bus is not okay. It's extremely dangerous. Our children will



ning in early September, and we need to take every precaution to ensure students get to and from school safely," said May-or Brown. "Motorists, please pay attention and do not pass a school bus illegally. The safety of our children is extremely important." To ensure students get

to and from school safely, cameras were installed on all Buffalo school buses last spring and are now capturing images of drivers who pass a stopped school bus. From now through September 30th, a grace period will remain in effect, with warning letters issued to violators during this trial period. Enforcement begins on October 1, 2024. On October 1st, tickets will be issued and could cost drivers who are caught illegally passing a school bus up to \$250.

According to the state's Traffic Safety Committee, roughly 50,000 vehicles illegally pass school buses every day in New York State. The cameras will snap an image of anyone who illegally passes a stopped school bus. The technology, installation, and maintenance are pro-

vided at no cost to the school district or taxpayers.




