On September 21, 2024, Western New Yorker's will walk to support of the Parkinson's community at Moving Day Buffalo!

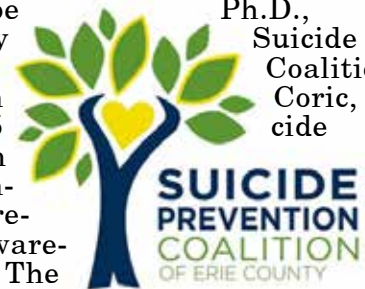

 groups in the country.

Scott's community involvement has been extensive through the years. He is the vice chair of the Roswell Park Alliance Foundation Board, and co-chaired their capital campaign to build the new Bieler Clinical Sciences Center. He is a Board of Director for Invest Buffalo Niagara, Daemen University, and a member of the Greater Buffalo Racial Equity Roundtable. Scott served on the Upstate New York Federal Reserve Regional Advisory Board for five years and has served on the Boards of the Buffalo Zoo, Buffalo Niagara Partnership, and Hilbert College. Scott has received the Doctorate of Humane Letters from both Hilbert College and Daemen University.

Kathy Bieler, a graduate of St. Bonaventure University with a bachelor's degree in accounting, earned her CPA while working at the public accounting firm of Freed Maxick. For more than 20 years, she served as finance and operations director for a prominent local financial group. She has been active for four terms in the environmental arena serving in leadership positions with the Western New York Land Conservancy, and currently is the board president.

Established in 1957, The Red Jacket Award is presented in recognition of "quiet, continued, unbroken devotion to our civic progress and needs by one who, through such devotion, has thereby enlarged our awareness of our heritage in order that it may be built upon for the enrichment of our future."

Owen B. Augspurger Award – Tyler Bagwell

Tyler Bagwell is a folk-singer, historian, brewery worker, and graphic designer from Buffalo. A self-described "patchwork songwriter with a busker's voice," he is always in search of couplets within the notion that "history rhymes." Drawing from a vast repertoire of songs and stories, he revives old songs and pieces together new works highlighting events, people, and places of local and national note.

While working for Kari-bu News in 2015, Tyler researched and wrote stories of Buffalo's immigrant heritage to highlight contemporary issues. A lifelong dedication to folk music and performance then led to a focus on Buffalo's musical history as a means to understand the city's identity. In 2019, Tyler staged a musical lecture entitled, "Low Bridge, Everybody Down: Buffalo's Story in Song" at the Buffalo History Museum.

The program highlighted a history of Buffalo from 1812-1912, told through the battle dirges, lake chanties, murder ballads, canal hollers, and underground railroad songs of that period.

Tyler has presented lectures on local music history at the Buffalo History Museum, the Niagara Celtic Heritage Festival, The Cave, Folkfaces Fest, the Eggertsville-Snyder Branch Library, and Buffalo Bike Tours. His writing has been published in Kari-bu News, American History Magazine, Rise Collaborative, and Belt Publishing's Buffalo Anthology. Recent music releases include "Irish Songs & Tunes" (2024), a collection of traditional and original songs recorded with fiddler and vocalist Sally Schaefer, and "Smugglers of Buffalo b/w Low Bridge, Everybody Down," (2019) a record of two traditional Buffalo folk songs. He continues to give lectures and perform live in Buffalo.

The Owen B. Augspurger Award was established in 1974 in honor of Owen B. Augspurger (1913-1969), a former History Museum president, and a Red Jacket awardee (1969). The award is presented to an individual for outstanding service to the cause of local history.

Daniel B. Niederlander Award – Buffalo Maritime Center

Buffalo Maritime Center (BMC) began over three decades ago as a creative experiment in teaching 3-D design in the Design Department at what is now Buffalo State University and has since evolved into an independent nonprofit. It has consistently played a central role in raising awareness and appreciation of Western New York's rich maritime heritage. It was initially called The Center for Watercraft Studies.

Boats, as design objects, are excellent for exploring form, function, and human culture. The Center offered an introductory Wood Design course, teaching 11 female students how to build a wooden kayak. BMC started collecting and restoring significant local boats, and even constructed full-sized replicas of lost vessels. Over time, The Center for Watercraft Studies transformed into the Buffalo Maritime Center.

Through hands-on learning programs for youth and adults, historical research, and various boatbuilding projects, the BMC has become a leading advocate for revitalizing Buffalo's waterfront and waterways. BMC has encountered countless talented, energetic individuals from all walks of life, many of whom have become

permanent volunteers. Its goal from the start has been to engage as many community members as possible. In 2025, BMC will further its mission by taking the replica Erie Canal Boat Seneca Chief on a historic voyage to New York City to commemorate the Bicentennial of the Erie Canal and celebrate community along the way.

Daniel B. Niederlander Award – Erie County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry

The Erie County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry was founded in May 1924 as the Erie County Parks Commission, comprised of a group of six appointed commissioners tasked with identifying future park land for acquisition. The first four parks, acquired in 1925, were Chestnut Ridge, Emery, Como Lake, and Ellcott Creek Parks. In 1947, Akron Falls Park was added to the County Parks system to make the fifth "Heritage Park" and further acquisitions continued steadily since that time. Currently, the Department manages over 10,000 acres of parkland throughout Erie County.

The mission of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry is to provide ample recreation opportunities for its patrons, to protect regionally important assets, to contribute to the economic vitality of the County, and to promote public awareness of parks resources. Today, the Erie County Parks Department is thriving, with strong leadership in all three program areas, a renewed focus on public engagement, education, and user experience, intensive and strategic investment in parks infrastructure, strong community and recreation partnerships, a focus on master planning, including an update to the Forestry Management Plan currently under way, and a growing focus on environmental compliance and habitat restoration.

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry is tasked with stewarding the natural and cultural assets found within the parks and forest lots and ensuring they remain accessible and sustainable for many years and generations to come.

The Daniel B. Niederlander Award was established in 1975, in honor of Niederlander (1895-1964), a former History Museum president, businessman, and dedicated civic leader. The award is presented to local education, cultural or heritage organizations for outstanding programming.

Drug Bust On Grant Street Of Dollar General Thief

North Buffalo
September 9, 2024
 Hertel Avenue - Victim reports defendant (landlord) did show up, follow victim to multiple addresses associated with victim, causing victim to be annoyed and alarmed. Supporting deposition available.

September 9, 2024
 Hertel Avenue - After being fired from Rich's Products, defendant did use a pocket knife to puncture tire of New York registered vehicle which was parked in parking lot. Incident observed by cameras at Rich's Products.

West Side
September 8, 2024
 Lafayette Avenue - Defendant has been reportedly coming to victims 1 and 2's apartment and kicking at their door. Defendant did threaten to fight victim 1 and physically assault him. Victims 1 and 2 are requesting an order of protection.

September 7, 2024
 West Delavan Avenue - On above date and loca-

tion from approximately noon while at 327 West Delavan Avenue in the lower apartment, defendant (husband) did threaten to kill the victim. Defendant did also obstruct victim's breathing by applying pressure to her neck with her hands, causing a bruise. The victim did not lose consciousness. Defendant did then leave apartment to go purchase beer. Once defendant left victim did lock door to the apartment. Defendant did then break the front window once he returned to gain entry back into the apartment at approximately 1426 hours. Defendant was again threatening to kill victim as well as threatening to shoot himself while holding a silver handgun. No gun was located inside premises.

September 7, 2024
 West Ferry Street - While investigating a larceny call from 244 Forest Avenue, officers located the defendant matching description at the corner of Grant and West Ferry Street. As officers attempted to stop the

defendant he fled south on Grant Street, ignoring verbal commands and reaching his right hand down the front of his pants. Once in custody the male was found to have an active Buffalo warrant. While in rear of patrol vehicle the defendant was seen moving around. When Officers opened back door of patrol vehicle at which time the male shoved a baggie with 13 individually packed blue envelopes believed to be heroin into his mouth and attempted to swallow it (3 grams). At the same time officers recovered individually packaged crack cocaine from the defendants pant leg. After arriving at central booking, as officers were taking the defendant out of vehicle, more individually packaged bags of crack cocaine were recovered from his hoodie pouch. There were 18 bags in total weighing approximately 5 grams all together. During the original incident at 244 Forest Avenue, the Dollar General, defendant did attempt to steal Gushers but was stopped by employees. While exiting the store the defendant threatened to come back and shoot everyone. Gushers were found on his person while transported to booking.

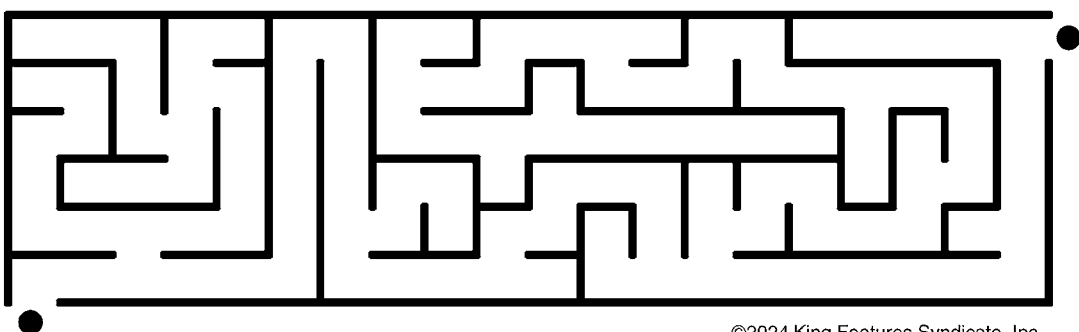

About Widow's Benefits vs. Benefits from my Ex-spouse – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: In November I will be 60 and eligible for widow's benefits. My late husband's Social Security was approximately \$2,300 when he passed around 7 years ago. FYI, my ex-husband is still working and will probably receive the highest SS when he retires in about 5 years (we were married for more than 10 years). Either of these is more than my own Social Security will be, so how does this work? Will this turn into my Social Security? Can I start on one and switch to the other later?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Dear Wondering Widow: Provided you have not remarried before age 60, you have a choice which benefit to receive – either your deceased husband's benefit as his surviving spouse, or your ex-spouse benefit from your ex-husband while he is still living. Taking your survivor benefit from your deceased husband will likely be best because it is based on 100% of his SS amount when he died, whereas your ex-spouse benefit from your living ex-husband is based on 50% of his FRA entitlement. To get an ex-spouse benefit from your ex-husband (which you can't get until you are 62), your own SS retirement benefit would need to be less

than 50% of your ex's FRA entitlement.

As you know, you will be eligible for survivor (widow's) benefits from your deceased husband when you are 60 but be aware that by taking your survivor benefit at 60, it will be reduced for early claiming. Rather than 100% of your husband's SS benefit, at age 60 you will get about 71.5%. Your surviving spouse benefit reaches maximum at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67 and will grow to that point but will be reduced if taken prior to that.

Also, if you are working, Social Security's "earnings test" will apply until you reach your full retirement age, so your plans for working may influence your decision on when to claim your widow's benefit. If you exceed the earnings limit (\$22,320 for 2024; it changes annually), Social Security will take away \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit. They "take away" by withholding future benefits until the penalty is satisfied, which means you would go some number of months without benefits. And, if you substantially exceed the earnings limit you may even be temporarily ineligible for any SS benefits (until you earn less or reach your FRA – the earnings test goes away at your FRA).

If you claim your surviving spouse benefits from your deceased husband first, and your ex-husband later dies, you do have the option to switch to the higher survivor benefit from your

ex-husband. In effect, if both husbands are deceased, you have a choice which benefit to take (and, obviously, you'd chose the higher of the two).

None of this, however, happens automatically. To claim your surviving spouse benefit you will need to contact Social Security directly at 1.800.772.1213 (or call your local SS office) to make an appointment to apply for widow's benefits.

REAL ID Outreach Event At West Side

REAL ID compliant identification will be required beginning May 7, 2025.

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns is reminding Erie County residents of the May 7, 2025 deadline to obtain an Enhanced or REAL ID compliant document, for which you will need in order to board any flight within the U.S. or to enter certain federal buildings, including military bases.

To help prepare residents, Kearns will be holding a REAL ID outreach event on Friday, September

27th from 10:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at West Side Community Services, located at 161 Vermont Street, Buffalo where the community can apply for their REAL ID compliant documents, as well as obtain vehicle registrations, turn-in license plates or simply learn more about obtaining a REAL ID compliant driver's license or non-driver identification, what documents are required, and to answer additional questions.

"We want the public to have every opportunity to obtain and select the necessary document that is

right for them as they do have a choice between an Enhanced Driver License (EDL), a REAL ID version, or simply maintain a Standard ID or Driver's License," stated Kearns. "Real IDs will not be necessary to drive a car, but not having the star or U.S. flag on your ID will prevent security issues or delays at airports. We want travelers to 'Be REAL ID Ready.'" Kearns added.

This "Clerk on the Go" event is open to the public and no appointments are required. There is no extra cost to get a REAL ID driver license or non-driver ID as there is for an Enhanced version. However, normal transaction fees do apply.

You can find out more about the REAL ID Act and review the list of acceptable documents required to meet the new compliance standard or book an on-line appointment by visiting erie.gov/clerk or call the Clerk's Outreach center at 716-858-8864.
