Children's Health Month: Healthy Homes For Healthier Kids

During Children's Health Month in October, the Erie County Department of Health (EC-DOH) is sharing information about environmental health and lead prevention in coordination with the WNY Children's Environmental Health Center.

"Our environment affects our health outcomes. It's essential that children have safe spac-

es to live, play, learn and grow," said Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein. "Homes and other spaces that are free from lead hazards, and air that is free from tobacco smoke and other pollutants, are the foundation for a healthier life."

"The environment has a huge impact on a child's health. People spend about 90% of their time indoors, so it's espe-

cially important to look at exposures in the home," said Sarah Ventre, MD, director of WNY Children's Environmental Health Center. "We're excited to collaborate with the Erie County Department of Health to provide resources that families need to create safer and healthier places to live. We encourage families to reach out to the Healthy Neighborhoods Program for free inspections and home safety materials."

Joe Willie And Tom Terrific!

It must have been around 1970 or 71 and I was 10 or 11 years old. I would ride my bike to a corner drugstore. Inside, I would head to the comic books and magazines near the front windows.

There, I would read football or baseball magazines about the Major League or NFL season and look at pictures of Joe Namath or Tom Seaver. They stared back at me, wanting to take them home

I learned that Joe Namath had led the Jets to an upset win over the Baltimore Colts in the 1969 Super Bowl and Tom Seaver had pitched the Mets to a World Series win in 1969 over the Baltimore Orioles. This was my world, outside the classroom in fifth or sixth grade. My friends knew all about these players and I just had to catch up. If I knew as much as they did, then they would talk to me.

That's how it got started for me and I've been following Sports since then. Buffalo Bills, Buffalo Braves and Buffalo Sabres. These were the years of OJ Simpson, Bob McAdoo and Gilbert Perreault. The Big three in Buffalo sports and my friends were all watching every game, win or lose. Most of the time it was a lose. But that didn't matter as long as we had our sports teams outside the classroom at School.

In response to a great article just weeks ago in this newspaper, written by a good friend, Charles Anzalone, it's indeed a pleasure to have the tables turned where you have to answer questions instead of doing the asking. I'm certainly glad to have had to opportunity to write about the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League all these 43 years as well as written some football, basketball and hockey stories at the North Buffalo Community Center, North Buffalo Rink and, of course, Shoshone Park.

When I first started writing for the ROCKET,

there were two separate youth baseball leagues in North Buffalo. There was once a baseball diamond located next to School #81 on Tacoma Avenue and I was giving

readers the names of many North Buffalo boys playing each Summer in the early to mid 1980's. The League on Tacoma was called Delaware-Hertel, aptly named because of its proximity to the nearby intersection. It had teams for all age levels of boys to compose a Minor and Major Division but their numbers in the amount of boys playing weren't as large as the nearby League in Shoshone Park.

But they were just as exciting to watch and to root for all the boys who lived on the many nearby streets around the Elementary School. Unfortunately, the League didn't last long in terms of opportunities for all boys and were forced to close. Most boys went and joined the Hertel North Park Youth League, where teams had expanded and Divisions

were set up for Girls Softball Divisions. Besides the two Leagues, I was writing about a men's slo-pitch League in Shoshone Park and going to area high schools like Bennett, St. Joe's or Nichols and writing football on the weekends in the fall. Basketball was big at St. Margaret's and hockey was born in North Buffalo with the Thundercats.

Without an early interest in sports, I probably didn't have any idea what I wanted to do with my life. Two Buffalo Public Grammar Schools, 85 and 82, gave me opportunities to write sports in School newspapers. We had a Grammar School Basketball team that was coached by David B. Thomas, a tremendous proponent for youth sports in Schools, who later became the head of the Buffalo Public Schools Athletic Department and served for many years until his retirement from the City of Buffalo. He was a huge asset to my early career as a working journalist for the Rocket. He coached a young Michael Phillips in the early 70's in Grammar School before Phillips was a Kensington Knight and a four year starter at Niagara University for the Purple Eagles.

I certainly thank everyone for reading these columns in Buffalo Rocket and I sincerely thank David Gallagher, the publisher, for giving me the opportunity 43 years ago.

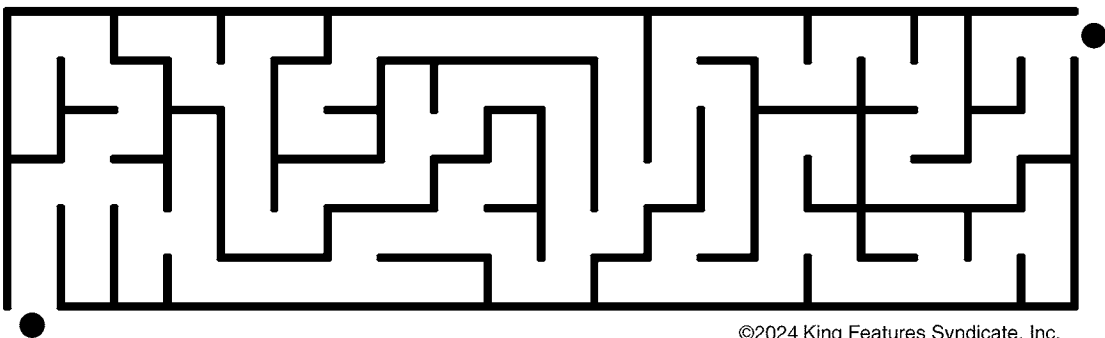

About Signing Up For Social Security And Medicare Part B At 70 – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I just turned 69 years old in August 2024 and am still working full time. I signed up for Medicare Part A but, it is my secondary insurance because I have great health insurance through where I work. My wife is retired and has Medicare Part A but, is on my insurance also, and she is taking Social Security. Our plan is for me to work until Au-

gust 2026 when I'll be 71. I'll file for Social Security when I turn 70, and bank all of it for a year until I retire. That is money we plan to use for travel and fun things. I have three questions: when should I file for my Social Security so it starts in September; when do my wife and I file for Medicare Part B (with a supplement) so it starts in September; and are

there negative tax implications to this plan that I haven't thought of?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor. Signed: **Needing Info.**

Dear Needing Info: Sounds like you have a great strategy planned for your personal Social Security benefits and your Medicare Part B enrollment for both of you. To your questions:

If you will be 70 in August 2025, you can apply for Social Security about 3 months prior (e.g., in May 2025). Just be sure to specify that you wish your SS benefits to start effective with the month of your 70th birthday. Signing up a few months early is perfectly okay – you will indicate your desired benefit start date on your ap-

plication, and that is when SS will start your benefits. Remember, SS pays benefits in the month following the month earned, so your first payment will be received in September 2025 (on the 2nd Wednesday if you were born before the 11th of the month).

As for Medicare Part B coverage for you and your wife, both of you can enroll in Medicare Part B a couple of months prior to you leaving work, but request that Medi-

care Part B coverage starts in the month your work coverage ends. In other words, you can enroll in Medicare before you retire from work but request that your Part B coverage starts in the first month your employer coverage ends (to avoid any gap in healthcare coverage). Obviously, you should begin your private supplemental healthcare coverage to coincide with the start of your Medicare Part B coverage.

Canisius Unveils Buffalo Promise Scholarship

Canisius University President Steve Stoute announced today the launch of an innovative new initiative aimed at expanding educational affordability and opportunity to the best and brightest local students. The Canisius Buffalo Promise Scholarship effectively covers 100% of tuition for up to four years of undergraduate study at the university to eligible admitted students.

Canisius anticipates that approximately 800 admitted students will qualify as Buffalo Promise scholars in the fall 2025 pilot year of the program, with a potential savings for students and families of more than \$25 million in the first year alone. Building on this strong start, Canisius projects approximately 4,000 students to qualify for the Buffalo Promise over the next five years, making it the most generous, most ambitious and most comprehensive combined aid program in the university's history.

"We know that a Canisius education is transformative, opening doors to opportunities and

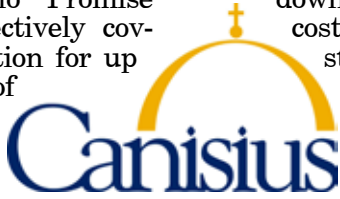
experiences that set students up for long-term success and a lifetime of meaning," President Stoute stated. "Our vision is to make the Canisius experience available to all qualified students by breaking down the barriers of cost and building up student outcomes, and the Buffalo Promise Scholarship is a significant step in that direction."

To be eligible for the scholarship, students must apply to Canisius and be admitted through the regular decision process, reside in Buffalo or any adjacent town with a ZIP code beginning with 142, and live in a household with

an adjusted gross income of \$125,000 or less. Undergraduate freshman enrolling for fall 2025 need to submit valid applications for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the New York Tuition Assistance Program by March 1, 2025.

The Buffalo Promise Scholarship has the potential to affect more than half of the university's incoming class in that it covers any remaining tuition costs after a student's federal, state and institutional aid are applied. This ensures that eligible students can attend Canisius without paying any out-of-pocket tuition expenses.

Children's Health Month: Healthy Homes For Healthier Kids

Continued from page one. is available to eligible households in specific ZIP codes in the city of Buffalo (14201, 14202, 14206, 14207, 14208, 14209, 14210, 14211, 14212, 14213 and 14215) and the City of Lackawanna (14218). Home visits include inspections and information about:

- Asthma
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Fire and burn safety
- Home safety / Unintentional injuries
- Indoor air quality
- Lead poisoning prevention
- Quitting smoking
- Taking care of your house and property

Asthma is a common chronic condition that affects many children and can severely limit their activities. Environmental triggers such as indoor allergens, air pollution, and exposure to tobacco smoke can worsen asth-

ma symptoms. Children living in housing that has mold, pests and pollution have a higher risk of developing childhood asthma.

October 20-26 is National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week. Lead is a poison and neurotoxin, even in small amounts, causing serious health problems and developmental delays. Children should be tested for lead at ages one and two or as recommended by a physician. If a child has a high lead level, other children in the household should also be tested.

If your house was built before 1978, assume your house has lead and take the necessary steps to keep your family safe.

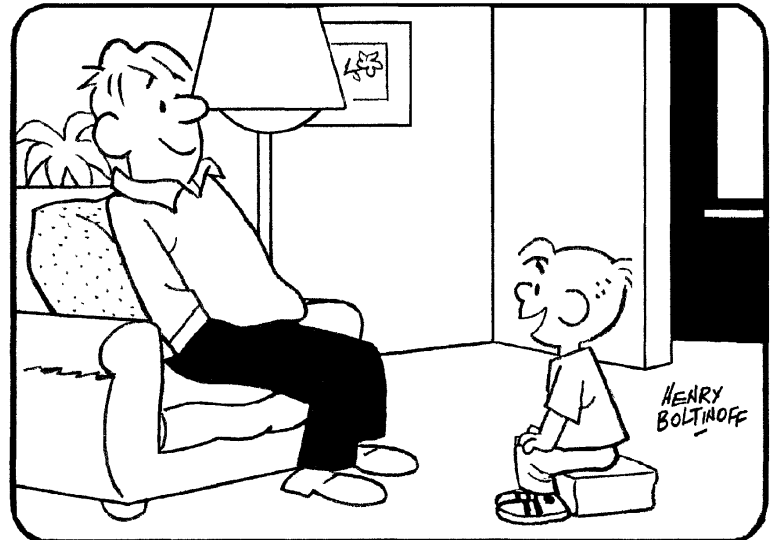

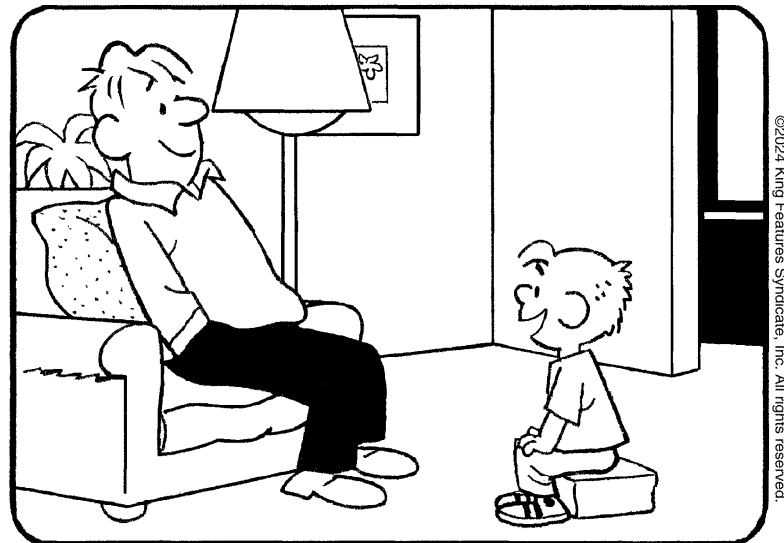

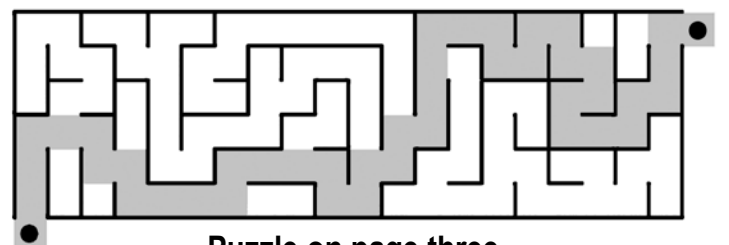
