## Happy Veteran's Day 2024!



The annual Veteran's Day Parade will take place this Saturday, November 2nd, starting at the Red Jacket and ending at the Buffalo Botanical Gardens.

Veterans Day occurs on November 11th every year in honor of the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918 that signaled the end of World War I, honoring the men and women of all wars who have served our Nation and answered the call to defend it. The United States rose to greatness on the strength of their service and their stories are woven into the fabric of our Nation's history.

Whether they served in times of war or peace, all veterans share a common bond, their belief in the cause of freedom. ## St. Marks Lions Roar!

For the second year in a row, the St. Mark's Varsity Baseball team won back to back championships in the Diocesan Catholic School League Division over Elmwood Franklin and City Honors players, 11-3 in a rout, played on a beautiful night at Canisius University.

Playing on a neutral field of the preeminent Jesuit College in WNY, six eighth grade boys led the maroon and white Lions to their second Championship in as many years and ended their careers without losing a single game. The 20-0-1 record over two seasons has made the Woodward

made the Woodward Avenue School one of the best athletic programs across Western New York in both public and parochial Divisions.

Hundreds of St. Mark's students, families, administration and supporters were on hand this night to watch the Lions win their fourth Championship over an eight year period and is a tribute to the amount of time spent between their games in practice throughout a season.

"It was incredible to me how hard these kids were willing to work all Fall to win," said Lions eight year coach Kevin Pritchard afterward. "I'm incredibly proud of these boys and grateful for my fellow coaches."

Pritchard has been a part of the Baseball program at St. Mark's for almost 20 years now, watching his three sons grow up and play within the past ten years. In his eight seasons as manager, he has watched over numerous young boys get started in a baseball career, showing his love for the game and his interest in their young lives.

This season, six eighth graders were a major reason how the team was able to repeat as Champions for St. Mark's. They are: Burke Ganci, the team's second baseman. Greyson Gor-

don, a towering right-hander on the mound who threw fast balls faster than you could see. John (JR) Hornung, a lanky first baseman who could stretch out for a catch to get the runner. Daniel Kooshoian, who patrolled Centerfield and was key in the team's defense. Paul Ru-

bino, a steady Shortstop for the infield and finally Drew Smith, a quiet leader on the team who spoke with his bat and the glove out on the diamond.

All six boys are prominent players in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League Travel program in Shoshone Park. After all the Championships have been won in League games, boys can continue to play for the various


Schools located around Shoshone Park like St. Mark's, City Honors, Olmstead or Canisius High School. Without their start in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League, (HNPYBL) the Schools wouldn't have reputable Sports programs in the Spring and early Fall.

Pritchard and his two assistants, Kevin Mahoney and Matthew Ward in the dug out, this year selected four players from the team with MVP performances. They are Dan Kooskoian for Defense, Drew Smith for Offense, John (JR) Hornung as most improved and Greyson Gordon as overall team MVP. Pritchard, Mahoney and Ward are all outstanding Coaches in the HNPYBL program each Summer and have worked with these boys almost every day each Sum-

Pritchard had the last word. "I would like to thank all the players, the coaches, and all the parents for their commitment to the team and to one another."

What else can be said or written about this year's World Series? The two best teams from each League battled it out in L A and New York. The free agent spending by the Dodgers to acquire Japanese phenom Shohei Ohtani from the Angels before the season was the missing piece for a Dodger team that was looking to celebrate a legitimate World Series victory after 2020 when Covid affected the game. The Yankees and Brian Cashman traded for Juan Soto before the season to compliment with Aaron Judge at the plate for more offense and a return to the play-offs. Both worked, but not without the help of Freddie Freeman, Mookie Betts or Kiki Hernandez. Gerrit Cole pitched well enough in game five after the Yankees won their first game last Tuesday, on an Anthony Volpe Grand Slam. Can the team resign Soto and improve their pitching to win the AL East again against a good Orioles team that played well all season. Let's hope the White Sox can figure things out in the Southside of Chicago and not lose 121 games. See you next year.





Dear Rusty: I retired at my full retirement age, am now 79 and will be 80 in December. I have been working consistently since. I get a meager Social Security benefit, only about \$800 due to my federal retirement offset. Most jobs I have held since filing and collecting SS have involved very labor-intensive work, to include my current position. This has taken a

My question: is there any provision in Social Security that permits re-evaluation of Social Security benefits for disability after one has collected and paid into the system for some 15 years? I suspect not but thought I would ask, since at my not so tender age, I am faced with having to cease employment that generates needed income.

**Dear Still Working:** I'm

Thus, since you retired and claimed SS at your full retirement age, no additional disability amount would be available anyway.

FYI, I admire, at your "tender age," that you are still actively working, but I'm afraid you cannot claim more now on Social Securi-

still actively working, but I'm afraid you cannot claim more now on Social Security disability because you've already reached your FRA. However, from what you've written, your SS retirement benefit has been affected by the so-called Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) which affects those with a separate pension earned without contributing to Social Security.

If you've been separately working (and contributing to Social Security) since you left government service, and you now have more than 20 years contributing to SS from other non-government "substantial earnings," it's possible that you can request a reevaluation of your WEP penalty. WEP provides relief for those who have more than 20 years contributing to Social Security. So, if you have more than that over your lifetime, you could ask that your WEP reduction be reevaluated to consider your additional years contributing to Social

Security. If that is the case, your monthly amount would be increased to consider those additional years contributing to SS since you first claimed.

I suggest, if you now have more than 20 years of contributions to Social Security from your non-government work over your lifetime, that you call Social Security to request reevaluation of your WEP retirement amount. FYI, you can see exactly how many years of SS-covered work you have by request-

ing an "Earnings Statement" from Social Security. You can get this Statement by calling 1.800.772.1213, or you can also get it at your personal "my Social Security" online account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount (Social Security will also be able to tell you this directly when you call). In any case, I wish you good fortune, and hope that reevaluating the WEP reduction to your SS benefit may offer some small financial relief as you go forward.






