This past Sunday, the Hertel North Park Baseball League (HNPY-BL) announced the sudden passing of a former member and long time friend Thomas M.

A devastating loss to anyone who learned the game, growing up in Sho-shone Park, playing Baseball in what was once called the Cardinals System of boys, ages six to 12 on teams like Springfield, Sacramento or San Jose during the 1980's and '90's before donning the red and yellow uniforms, just like the Major League Cardi-nals. He taught hundreds of boys, including his three sons; William, Matthew and Hugh and was a friendly face to anyone in the Park on a daily basis. He was 61.

Wolf was a fierce advocate for the League, assuring everyone of fair play and opportunities for both boys and girls while in the Park. He was a vital member of the HNPY-BL Board for many years, finding ways to better the League, even after the season ended. His son, Matthew is still an

active coach and Board member to this day. The League extends \mathbf{their} heartfelt sympathies to his wife Jeanne at this difficult time. He will be extremely missed.

Signed: Confused about Medicare Premiums Dear Confused: I be-

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lieve you are referring to "Income-Relat-Medicare's ed Monthly Adjustment Amount," or "IRMAA." IR-MAA increases the Medicare Part B (and Part D) premium amounts for those whose combined income from all sources exceeds specified levels for their IRS tax filing status. Social Security (and Medicare) get your earnings information from the IRS and use your reported IRS income (on your income tax re-

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care premium each year. But there is a twist – they use your reported combined income (also known as your "MAGI" or "Modified Adjusted Gross Income") from 2 years ago to determine your current year's Medicare premium. For example, they will use your 2023 MAGI to determine your 2025 Medicare Part B premium (and your Part D premium if you have Part D).come scale to determine your Medicare premium. If you filed your 2022 taxes as "married/jointly" and your combined income for that year was \$206,000 or less, for 2024 you are paying the standard Medicare Part B premium of \$174.50, and there is no additional amount added to your Part D premium. But if your MAGI as a married couple was over \$206,000 your Medicare premiums will be more – e.g., MAGI up to \$258,000 makes your Part B premium \$244.60 and results in a Part D supplement of \$12.90 per month.



SPCA Announces Dog Kennel Renovations, Adjusted Dog Admissions, and Foster Home Needs

Thanks in part to generous support from the NYS Companion Animal Capital Fund and SPCA donors, the SPCA Serving Erie County is thrilled to announce upcoming renovations to its dog kennel floors and meet and greet rooms! This project will provide a more comfortable, welcoming, and hygienic space for dogs in their care.

"Our dedicated animal care staff conducts rigorous daily cleaning of the kennels to prevent the spread of disease," says SPCAPresident and CEO Caitlin Daly. "However, this essential sanitation can, over time, damage flooring materials. By refinishing the floors, we can eliminate cracks and crevices that harbor germs, ensuring a safer and healthier space for our dogs. The effects of proper flooring on dog welfare is well-documented, and keeping the flooring comfortable, germ-free, and safe, with their feet exposed to as few irritants as possible, is paramount to their health. These renovations will significantly improve the quality of life for dogs while they await their new homes.'

To minimize disruption and prioritize the well-being of resident dogs during the monthlong renovation, the SPCA will adjust its dog admissions process:

Starting December 2: The SPCA will reduce the number of dogs admitted to the shelter. Starting January 2: The SPCA will temporarily pause admissions of new dogs while

construction is underway. While capacity is limited, the SPCA will prioritize admitting dogs with the most urgent needs, such as those rescued from unsafe environments or requiring immediate medical care.

Call for Foster Homes

The SPCA is seeking temporary dog foster homes to provide the best possible experience for adoptable dogs during renovations. "Opening your home to a dog is a rewarding experience," says Adoptions and Foster Care

Manager Jill Antes. "While we don't know the exact dates yet, we expect we'll need to find temporary foster homes for some of our adoptable dogs. If you're open to fostering during our renovation period, we'd love to add you to our list of potential foster families! We're asking that foster homes commit to at least one month and be willing to participate in the adoption process. This may include bringing the dog to scheduled meet-and-greets at the shelter or allowing potential adopters to visit the dog in your home." Fostering is free, and the SPCA provides all necessary supplies.
