This has been a great year for anyone following both the local and national Sports teams in 2024. 

You remember how we decided to "eat" a lot of Stefon Diggs salary by finding him a team that we could trade him to before the season. The folks in Houston were agreeable and they were still building an offense around second year quarterback C.J. Stroud. We played them once already in Houston and took our second loss, a 23-20 decision where Stefon was somewhat of a factor in the win. We were still playing well after just five weeks.

Then, you obviously know that the Bills couldn't keep their two Safeties, Micah Hyde and Jordan Poyer on their roster this year. Hyde retired but Poyer ended up signing with the Miami Dolphins. We gave the Dolphins their first loss of the season in a 31-10 victory in Miami. And through all this season so far, we've discovered a resilience formed in the hearts and minds of all 53 men on this roster. By the time you read this, our game against the Patriots will probably give us a dozen wins. Who knows what can happen in the Playoffs. With a high ankle sprain suffered to Patrick Mahomes last week against Cleveland, the Chiefs might be due for a fall as the #1 cede in the AFC Playoffs. The Steelers are right behind us followed by the Ravens. Denver has come on and tied with the Chargers in the West with 9-6 records. With just three games to play in the Regular Season, the Bills are ending 2024 with a chance to send their team to Las Vegas in February for the Super Bowl. Who knows which team the Bills will face but one thing is for certain. Josh Allen is the ultimate leader of this team and he,s proved it every week of this season to be the League' s MVP. then I would have drawn \$16,400 per year. Instead, I got \$680 per month from 62 to 75, or \$8,160 per year, or about \$106,000 over 13 years. Compare that to the age 65 amount of \$14,400 per year for 10 years, which is \$144,000. Šo, by claiming at 62, at age 75 I have saved the government over \$38,000. It would make seniors lives so much easier if they could draw full Social Security at 75 years old, af-

ter getting only part of their SS. Thank you in advance for

your service as a Social Security Advisor.

Dear Second-guessing: Dear Confused: The difference between benefits claimed at various ages causes many to reflect, as you have done, about what might have been had you waited longer to claim. But

there is an error in your calculations. If your age 62 monthly benefit is \$680, your age 65 monthly benefit would have been about \$845, not \$1,200. Thus, at 75 you would have collected about \$101,400 by claiming at 65, vs. the \$106,000 you have received by claiming at age 62. In other words, you still would not have broken even had you claimed at age 65. Social Security says that

it doesn't matter when you claim – they say that if you claim early your payments will be less, but you'll get more of them. Where SSA's argument falls apart is when life expectancy is longer. Our experience is that if you wait until your full retirement age (FRA) to claim (which is age 66 in your case), vs. claiming at age 62, you will collect the same amount of total money at about age 78. In other words, the "breakeven age" for waiting until FRA to claim is about 78. So, you will reach your personal "breakeven age" in about 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  years (at age 78). And this is precisely why we encourage everyone to understand their life expectancy when deciding when to claim Social Security - those who expect to live longer will, indeed, get more SS money if they delay claiming.

tauqua-Cattaraugus County Library System can secure a pass with their library card to receive up to four free general admissions to the Museum






