The Buffalo and Erie County Botanical Gardens welcomes visitors to enjoy a flower-filled event like never before during their Orchid Exhibit and Orchids After Dark. Enjoy over 2,000 orchids of all colors, shapes and sizes in an exciting tropical escape this winter. The Orchid Exhibit will be open daily from now through March 9 from 10:00am to 4:00pm. The exhibit will also be open in the evening with special lighting during Orchids After Dark on select nights and during sever-



al other special events. Orchids After Dark is open on February 1, 7-8, 11, 15-18, 21-22, 27-28, and March 1 and 8 from 6:00pm to 9:30pm. The Orchid Exhibit will dazzle visitors like never before. With over 2,000 stunning orchids, and quadruple the number of blooms, there are incredible sights to see at every corner. The exhibit is made up of several different varieties, colors, shapes, and sizes of orchids. They are arranged into incredible displays using several different methods of hanging and

wrapping. Visitors will not only enjoy the warmth and the views, but will also learn about the intricacies of orchid structures and their growth.

One of the favorite features of last year's Orchid Exhibit was the orchid arches. This year, there are three full arches in the Palm Dome. They are metal trellises covered in chicken wire and moss, planted with dozens of orchids allowing visitors to walk under and get a close look at the details of the orchids. For Love Of The Game!

February's here. That means everyone in North Buffalo loves the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League.

While everyone celebrates Valentine's Day in their own special way, February 14th is generally when pitchers and catchers report to Major League Baseball Training Camps held in Arizona and Florida. The Blue Jays, Mets and Yankees are in Florida while teams like the Dodgers, Giants or Rockies settle in Arizona. This season, Opening Day is on Thursday, March 28th when approximately 15 umpires around home plate will yell "Play Ball!"

In North Buffalo, the season gets underway on Saturday, May 3rd but when you're a volunteer coach for a girls or boys house team, you've been practicing now in various buildings like the Kevin T. Keane Sports Park at Nardin Academy, All In Sports in Cheektowaga or the Sports Performance Park in Williamsville. Soon, however, the Thomas M. Smith Athletic Center will be opening its new doors in March and will be welcoming everyone in the HNPYBL an opportunity to meet and practice in a new facility just in time for the start of the baseball and softball season.

According to the City, the Thomas Smith facility is making great progress towards completion in the coming weeks and an announcement should be made soon as to when the Center will open. The building inside Shoshone Park has been looked upon by League officials as a "homerun" for the Community. With registration numbers over 1,000 boys and girls over the past few years since the Pandemic, both house and travel teams have always had to travel into the Suburbs around Buffalo to find facilities built closer to some other leagues in the area like Lou Gehrig, Mathewson/ McCarthy or Central Amherst Leagues. This created a hardship for some families, working hard to get boys and girls to these sites, sometimes during rush hour traffic.

The League has already been meeting for the 2025

season. Families are urged to register now and not wait until the weather changes. For years, the League has always had to make "waiting lists" of children registered to play after a League deadline. The League also informed families last week in a letter, that they will be unable to honor specific coach or teammate requests outside of relatives of a family. These changes are the result of the evolving size of the entire League and will make for a better season for all.

As we go to press, League board members are beginning to work on procuring the many area businesses that have sponsored teams in the past. Familiar Hertel Avenue names like Bob & John's LaHacienda, Johnny's Meats or Korona Jewelers are regular sponsors for the League every year but newcomers to the Park have included Clayton's Toys, Bertha's Diner and Moor Room. The name of a Hertel Avenue Business on a child's uniform jersey enhances the experience for the boy or girl playing in nearby Shoshone Park.

Last season, there were a total of 78 teams in the Park at least, who were battling for first place in ten different divisions every day, from early May until mid July. If you were there, you saw some incredible baseball and softball games being played nightly and on Saturday. In case you missed it, here are your winners.

In Major Girls, the Griffs won the Championship over the Buckeyes in a double elimination playoff format. All playoff games in Hertel North Park are played within double elimination brackets where a team needs to keep winning in order to move on. If a team loses twice against any other divisional opponent, their season is over. Again, it must be stressed, every team in Hertel North Park is eligible for the playoffs.

In Triple AAA Girls, the Bulldogs went undefeated during the regular season and battled a surprising Purple Eagles team for the Championship victory. Even though a team may struggle

during the regular season, a team like the Purple Eagles turned their season around.

The Tigers won the Championship in Double AA with a first place finish in the standings and then fought the Razorbacks for the title in very exciting games. The Shamrocks won the Championship in Rookie Girls over the Angels in some spectacular softball play from girls ages six or seven. Their games were some of the most exciting played, according to many families on hand to watch.

On the Boys side, the Phillies and the Mets turned out to be the best two teams in the Major Boys Division and in a very close, 1-0 final, the Philadelphia team scored early and hung on to win the Championship. In Triple AAA, the Athletics won the Championship over the Mariners in some great Baseball of two highly talented teams that battled til the end. Other teams like the Angels, Royals and Tigers made the playoffs interesting but the green and gold of the A's won out.

Oh, yes, there is a Dodgers team in Shoshone Park too and these eight year old boys defeated the Phillies in Double AA and they didn't even need a Japanese hitter named Ohtani. The Royals defeated the Red Sox and the Orioles defeated the Angels in Rookie Boys.

The Devils defeated the Wolfpack in Rookie Girls. The Dodgers defeated the Mariners in Senior Boys and the Longhorns defeated the Wolverines in Senior Girls.

To register your son or daughter to play this season, go to the League's website www.hnpybl.com and click on the registration tab. If you are new to North Buffalo and Shoshone Park, the League asks politely for a copy of your child's birth certificate and for as little as \$150.00, your child will be guaranteed a turn at bat, a position on a diamond and a uniform to wear all season. More information is available on the website or you can call (716)862-0243 anytime and someone will return your call within 24 hours.

On February 6th, Paul Nasca, the head coach of the Baseball St. Joe's Marauders will come to Shoshone Park to speak with volunteer coaches at 7:00pm. Carm Panara will be at Shoshone February 12th at 7:30pm, Ron Torgalski, from the University of Buffalo will speak February 18 at 8:00pm and Nichols head coach Brian Bizarre will be at Shoshone at 8:30 pm. All meetings are part of the Hot Stove portion of the HNP season and are free and open to all coaches. Contact Jim Daley to make reservations.

At this writing, Opening Day for the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League is just 95 days away.

About Widow's Benefits vs. Benefits from my Ex-spouse – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: In November I will be 60 and eligible for widow's benefits. My late husband's Social Security was approximately \$2,300 when he passed around 7 years ago. FYI, my ex-husband is still working and will probably receive the highest SS when he retires in about 5 years (we were married for more than 10 years). Either of these is more than my own Social Security will be, so how does this work? Will this turn into my Social Security? Can I start on one and switch to the other later?

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor. Signed: **Wondering Widow**

Dear Wondering Widow: Provided you have not remarried before age 60, you have a choice which benefit to receive – either your deceased husband's benefit as his surviving spouse, or your ex-spouse benefit from your ex-husband while he is still living. Taking your survivor benefit from your deceased

husband will likely be best because it is based on 100% of his SS amount when he died, whereas your ex-spouse benefit from your living ex-husband is based on 50% of his FRA entitlement. To get an ex-spouse benefit from your ex-husband (which you can't get until you are 62), your own SS retirement benefit would need to be less than 50% of your ex's FRA entitlement.

As you know, you will be eligible for survivor (widow's) benefits from your deceased husband when you are 60 but be aware that by taking your survivor benefit at 60, it will be reduced for early claiming. Rather than 100% of your husband's SS benefit, at age 60 you will get about 71.5%. Your surviving spouse benefit reaches maximum at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67 and will grow to that point but will be reduced if taken prior to that.

Also, if you are working, Social Security's "earnings test" will apply until you reach your full retire-

ment age, so your plans for working may influence your decision on when to claim your widow's benefit. If you exceed the earnings limit (\$22,320 for 2024; it changes annually), Social Security will take away \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit. They "take away" by withholding future benefits until the penalty is satisfied, which means you would go some number of months without benefits. And, if you substantially exceed the earnings limit you may even be temporarily ineligible for any SS benefits (until you earn less or reach your FRA – the earnings test goes away at your FRA).

If you claim your surviving spouse benefits from your deceased husband first, and your ex-husband later dies, you do have the option to switch to the higher survivor benefit from your ex-husband. In effect, if both husbands are deceased, you have a choice which benefit to take (and, obviously, you'd chose the higher of the two).

None of this, however, happens automatically. To claim your surviving spouse benefit you will need to contact Social Security directly at 1.800.772.1213 (or call your local SS office) to make an appointment to apply for widow's benefits.

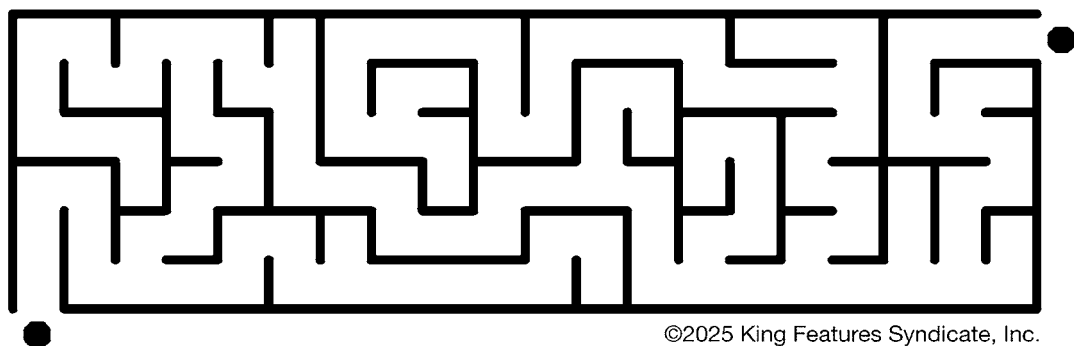

Unfair Interest Rates On Property Owners Behind On Taxes

Erie County, New York-Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns, in collaboration with the WNY Law Center, proposed a compelling resolution to the Erie County Legislature seeking to Amend the Erie County Tax Act.

By backing this resolution, the Erie County Legislature would strongly urge the New York State Legislature to introduce a bill that will reduce the interest rate in the Erie County Tax Act from 18% to 12%. This change is essential to alleviate excessive interest rates on homeowners while also preventing blight and abandonment throughout all of Erie County.

"As of November 2024, a total of 20 Erie County home-owners owed Erie County approximately \$4.5M," stated Kearns. "I also call on the Erie County Legislature to implement a

payment plan prior to the foreclosure process."

Research by the Law Center has shown that homeowners in low to moderate income zip codes are particularly vulnerable to the effects of delinquent property taxes. Jordan Modrzynski, Managing Attorney of Housing at the WNY Law Center said, "Our clients are not willingly avoiding their property taxes. Often, people fall behind due to a medical diagnosis, job loss, family emergency, or death in the family. A compounding interest rate of 18% makes it so these homeowners are never able to climb over the wall of debt that accumulates."

It is important to know that the majority of tax delinquent properties are occupied. As of November 2024, a total of 20 Erie County homeowners owed

Erie County approximately \$4.5 million.

In Erie County, a staggering amount of over \$50 million is owed on 7,043 properties by residents who are behind on their property taxes by more than \$500. In fact, \$18,991,413.54 is just in interest alone, with one property owner owing Erie County over \$750,000. This significant debt not only puts a strain on individual homeowners but also has far-reaching implications for the community as a whole.

Throughout the summer, Erie County Clerk Kearns and his staff worked tirelessly to address this pressing issue. Recognizing the urgent need for action, they collected over 5,000 signatures in support to lower the exorbitant 18% interest rate that is currently in place for delinquent property taxes.

Kearns added, "Not adopting this Resolution would mean that the steep 18% interest and penalty rate in Erie County would continue to remain unchallenged and that the interest accrued consumes a substantial portion of home equity when that homeowner is eventually foreclosed upon."

Continued from page one. is the Japanese word for, "moss ball" and refers to the practices of planting orchids and other types of plants in a sphere of soil and moss. These floating orbs take on a new design this year and are sure to amaze returning and new visitors. Those interested in Kokedama can learn how to create their own, custom kokedama during the Kokedama Workshop on March 22, from 2:00pm to 3:00pm.

Perhaps the most exciting addition to this year's Orchid Exhibit is the inclusion of Watercolor Orchids. These unusually colored orchids have been manipulated by horticulturalists and growers to produce uniquely colored flowers. These striking hues of teal, green, purple, peach and multi-color are nothing like the colors that would be found naturally in the wild. To create this effect, colored dye is carefully injected into the stem of a white-flowering orchid. The dye is a special, water-based formula that does not harm the orchids. These whimsical orchids are incredibly saturated and are strikingly different from the average orchid.
