Memorial Day 2025



This year, Memorial Day takes place on Monday, May 26th.

Memorial Day is observed as of 1971, on the last Monday of May. This year it will be Monday, May 26th. It honors those who serve every year. It honors those of the U.S. military who died in American wars. One of the biggest Memorial Day traditions is for the president or vice president to give a speech. Another is for the president or vice president to lay a wreath on soldiers' graves in the largest U.S. military burial ground, Arlington National Cemetery, in Virginia.



The history of Memorial Day goes back more than a century and a half in our countries' history.

Three years after the Civil War ended, on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of Union veterans — the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) — established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the war dead with flowers.

Friends Of Reinstein Woods Improves Woodland Garden

Friends of Reinstein Woods has received a \$20,717 grant from the Environmental Protection Fund's Park and Trail Partnership Grants program to enable visitor access and improve habitats in the Woodland Garden Enclosure at Reinstein Woods Nature Preserve. On Saturday, May 3, more than 20 volunteers made improvements to the en-

closure as part of I Love My Park Day.

"The Woodland Garden enhances the forest ecosystem while providing opportunities for learning and public enjoyment," said Friends Board President Daniel Haessler. "We are thrilled that this grant will help us complete the next phase of this important project."

Reinstein Woods' 2021

Forest Management Plan warned that the severe pressure from deer predation is damaging the forest. In 2023, the Friends received a grant from Parks & Trails New York to erect a deer fence around about an acre of land, creating the Woodland Garden Enclosure.

The 2025 grant will provide special gates so trail visitors can access the enclosure while keeping out deer. *Continued on page six.*

It was the teams second win in a row and with a victory over the Rays on Saturday, they tie the Rangers with 3-0 records in first place. The Devils defeated the Wolfpack and the Shamrocks topped the Diamonds, 6-2 in Rookie Girls. The Tigers shut out the Bonnies, 6-0 in Double AA Girls and the Red Sox and Twins played to a 1-1 tie.

Bruins defeated the Huskies, 8-5 while the Buckeyes and Griffs played to a 10-10 tie. The Hokies and Ducks played under the lights last Thursday night and played to a 21-20 slugfest in six innings.

How Do I Apply For Social Security? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I just turned 65 years old in February 2025. I need to sign up for Social Security but don't even know where to start.

Signed: Seeking Assistance

Dear Seeking: It is fairly easy to sign up for your Social Security benefits, by either calling the Social Security Administration at 1.800.772.1213 or your local SS office, to make a telephone appointment to apply, or by completing your application for Social Security benefits online here. However, to apply for benefits online you will need to first create your personal "my Social Security" account here. Once you have your personal account set up, you can apply directly

from that account and also see an estimate of your SS benefits at different ages.

You may already be aware that age 65 is not your Social Security full retirement age, or "FRA." Your FRA is when you get 100% of the benefit you've earned from a lifetime of working. By taking benefits at age 65, your monthly amount will be reduced (to about 87% of your FRA amount; a permanent reduction). Born in 1960, your FRA is age 67, which means you will be taking your SS benefit about two years early and also means that – if you are still working – you will be subject to Social Security's Annual Earnings Test (AET). The AET limits how much you can earn before some of your benefits

are taken away. For 2025, the annual earnings limit is \$23,400 and, if that is exceeded, SS will take back \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit (they take benefits back by withholding future payments long enough to recover what you owe).

So, you can apply for your Social Security benefits, as indicated above, either online or by calling SS for an appointment. Just be aware that by applying at age 65 your benefit will be permanently reduced, and you will be subject to Social Security's earnings limit (the earnings limit lasts until you reach your FRA, after which you can earn as much as you like without penalty).

Also, because you are 65, if you wish to enroll in Medicare, please be aware that you don't need to take your Social Security benefits to enroll in Medicare. You can enroll in Medicare (only) by calling Social Security as explained above or enrolling in Medicare online. This link explains how to enroll in only Medicare.

Kearns Calls On Purple Heart Recipients To Be Honored

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns will again honor veterans that have been bestowed the Purple Heart by adding their name to the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients Book of Merit. Kearns is encouraging veterans who were awarded the Purple Heart or their surviving family members to submit their request to his office by August 1st in order to be added to the 2024 edition and be part of this year's ceremony. Purple Heart veterans or their families must complete a short application that



can be obtained online at erie.gov/clerk/Purple-HeartForm or by email at salutes@erie.gov as well as provide proof the award was issued. Those with additional questions can call the Erie County Clerk's office at 716-858-6787.

"I think it is important to honor the brave men and women who have served and sacrificed for our Country. They deserve to be recognized and I am pleased we can maintain a record of our local military heroes at the Erie County Clerk's Office", stated Kearns.

Kearns established the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients Book of Merit in 2018 and has committed to add to the book each year with

new recipients, which is now in its sixth year. The book is named after Buffalo native and leading advocate for the Central Intelligence Agency, William J. Donovan. Donovan would receive three Purple Hearts during his service in the military, and would go on to heard the predecessor of the CIA, during World War II.

The complete volume of the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit is on display year-round at the Erie County Clerk's Office in Old County Hall located at 92 Franklin Street, Buffalo. It presently holds five hundred forty (540) names of those honored with the Purple Heart from Erie County.

The Purple Heart is the oldest military decoration awarded to members of the United States military who were wounded or killed while serving, on or after April 5, 1917. Originally called the Badge of Military Merit, the Purple Heart was created by George Washington on August 7, 1782. In addition to receiving a purple heart shaped award, the

honoree's name and regiment were inscribed in a "Book of Merit" which was lost after the Revolutionary War and the award was largely forgotten until over 100 years later.

Kearns will recognize the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients and honor all Purple Heart veterans during a ceremony on Wednesday, August 7th which also serves as National Purple Heart Day annually. Complete ceremony details will be made available as the event date approaches.

In addition, Old County Hall will be lit up purple, August 5-11th, in honor of Purple Heart Appreciation Day and in solemn recognition of all service members injured or killed in action.

Continued from page one. side, raised garden beds, constructed by teens from Cheektowaga High School, will provide a safe space to grow a variety of native wildflowers that normally would not survive being eaten by the large deer population at Reinstein Woods. Shrubs and other native wild plants will be added along a footpath. Benches and educational signs will provide opportunities for visitors to reflect and enjoy the peaceful setting. The Woodland Garden also provides opportunities for local students to study and learn about the forest ecosystem.

During I Love My Park Day on May 3, volunteers from Daemen University's Tennis Team

and Friends of Reinstein Woods reinforced portions of the fence, cleared the future footpath path of debris, and cleared the area where the raised garden beds will be installed. The path and gates are expected to be completed by late 2025.

The grant is one of 28 awards totaling \$1.8 million for organizations dedicated to the stewardship and promotion of New York's state parks and historic sites, trails, and public lands. The Park and Trail Partnership Grants are administered by Parks & Trails New York, a statewide non-profit organization, in partnership with the NYS Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic

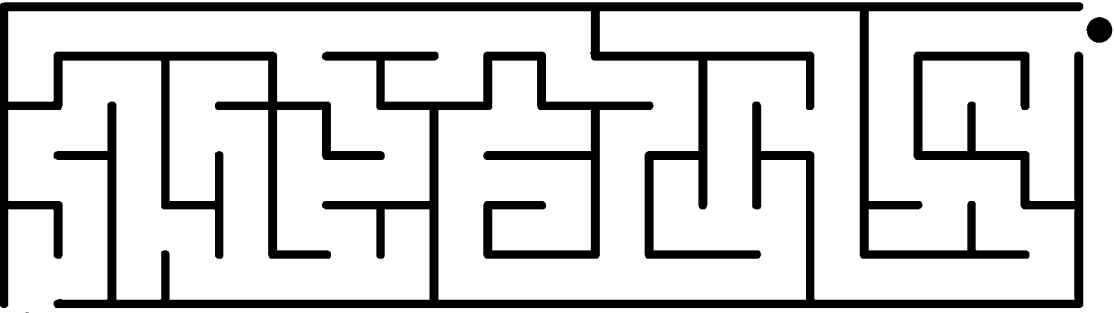
Preservation.

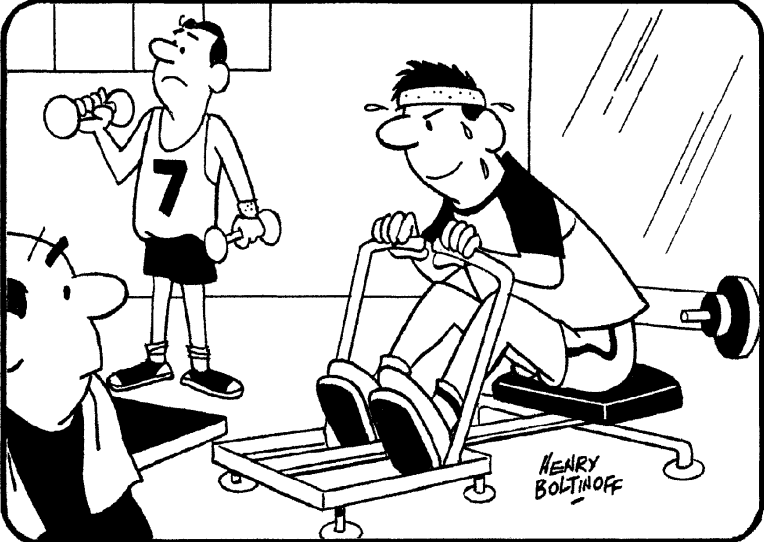

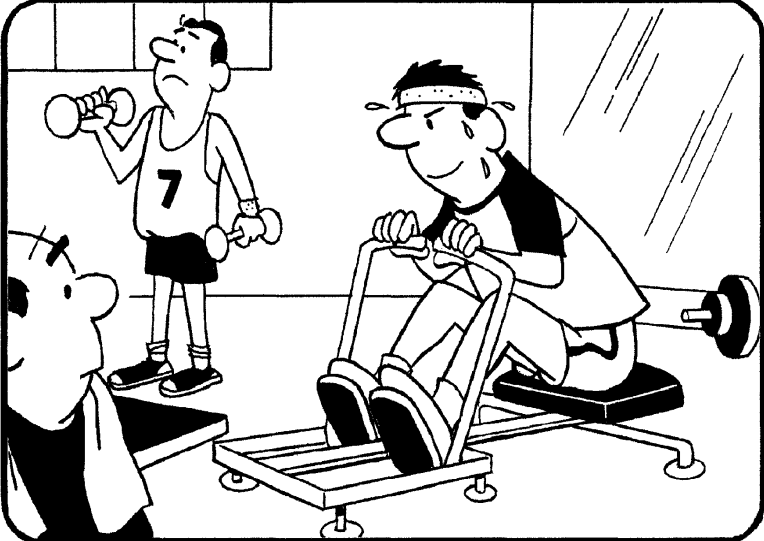

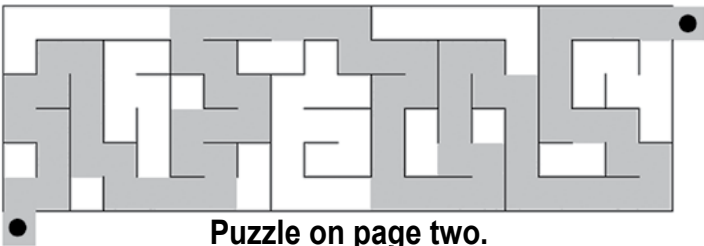
