ages and skill levels. To give riders many opportunities to participate in their favorite route, the Ride has added additional start times for 2025.



workers." "Checking in on each oth-


er is an essential first-line



## "Over The Hump!"

Twelve year old Christian Cipolla won't ever forget the weekend he had earlier this month of May.

Back on Saturday, May 17th, playing for the North Buffalo Blaze Travel team at home in Shoshone Park, the team grabbed an early lead against the Buffalo Rake after just two innings. With the skies quickly darkening over North Buffalo, Cipolla watched as teammate Jack Kleeh got on base with a single after one out in the bottom of the third. Cipolla stepped to the plate and just wanted to knock his friend in to up the score.

"Their picher was throwing fastballs," said the Blaze third baseman afterward, "and I just wanted to get over the hump."

hump." Christian Cipolla sure did. He took a mighty swing at the next pitch and blasted a two run homerun over the fence in leftfield in the friendly confines of the Park he has grown up in, his first ever homerun over a fence since he began playing rookie baseball. Hwis Mom and Dad were thrilled and so was his older brother and sister, John and Julia. The homerun helped lead the Blaze to an 8-6 victory over the Rake.

Then, the next day, Cipolla and the Blaze traveled into Hamburg to face the Dawgs in a doubleheader against the tough team. With teammates Kleeh and Brady Roberts on base in the top of the fifth, Cipolla blasted his second homerun over the fence in two days with a three run dinger that won the game in a 12-10 victory for the Blaze.

"I would like to thank all my teammates for believing in me," said Cipolla recently. "They are Lucas Adamczyk Turkovich, Brady Roberts, Connor Gunnarson, Jack Kleeh, Vince Martin, Maddox Beale, Jace Petti, Brody Large, Brady Huard and Alex Felver. They know who they are. I want to thank my Mom and Dad and my brother and sister for helping me. I want to thank my coaches, Mr. Huard, Mr. Gunnarson and Mr. Petti and everyone else who is a part of the Hertel North Park League."

Charlie Schutte hit two singles, a double and a triple for the Blue Jays in a big win over the Rays in Rookie Boys. The Reds picked up their first win of the season in Major Boys with a 5-3 win over the Dodgers. The Cardinals defeated the Pirates, 8-1 and the Dodgers defeated the Phillies, 4-1, in Double AA.

In Triple AAA, the Athletics defeated the Twins, 6-2 and the Blue Jays topped the Royals, 16-10. The Buckeyes defeated the Hokies, 9-4 and the Griffs beat the Bruins, 19-12.

This week, the Senior Boys and Senior Girls Divisions are underway. These teams are made up of boys and girls who play for the various high schools in the area. ## When Should My Wife Claim Social Security Benefits? – Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I turned 64 in July and my wife turned 62 in August. My wife has not worked for approximately 15 years but does qualify for Social Security on her prior work record. My wife is having some physical issues and would like to not return to work. Since she is eligible to collect Social Security, that would be an option to provide additional income, so she doesn't have to work. My question is how would it affect her future SS spousal benefits based on my record if she begins collecting her own benefit now? I plan to work until at least my full retirement age (67), and maybe longer, but plan to start collecting SS at 67 even I continue working.

Thank you in advance for your service as a Social Security Advisor. Signed: Working Hus-

band

Dear Working: If your wife has the required 40 SS quarter credits, she is eligible to collect reduced retirement benefits at 62 (for that needed extra income), but her age 62 benefit will be about 70% of what it would be if she waited until her SS full retirement age (FRA) to claim. That reduction would, in turn, carry over to her spousal benefit when you eventually claim your SS benefit. Here's why:

Your wife's spousal amount when you claim will be a combination of her own SS retirement benefit, plus an auxiliary amount (a "spousal boost") that she is entitled to as your spouse. At age 62, her own benefit will be cut by 30% and she can collect that reduced amount until you claim, at which point her spousal boost will be added to make her benefit equal her spousal entitlement. So, her total benefit as your spouse (when you claim) will consist of her reduced age-62 amount, plus an additional amount as your spouse.

If you claim at 67, your wife will be about 2 years short of her own FRA, which means that her spousal boost amount will also be reduced for early claiming. That reduced spousal boost will be added to her already reduced (age 62) SS retirement benefit, which will make her total benefit less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount.

So, your wife claiming her own reduced SS retirement benefit at 62 also means her spousal benefit amount will be affected, and taking her spousal boost before her FRA means that the boost amount will also be reduced for early claiming. The only way your wife can get the full 50% of your FRA entitlement is to wait

until she reaches her own FRA (67) to claim Social Security benefits.


## **Kearns Calls On Purple Heart Recipients To Be Honored**

Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns will again honor veterans that have been be-

stowed the Purple Heart by adding their name to the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients Book of Merit. Kearns is encourag-

ing veterans who were awarded the Purple Heart or their surviving family members to submit their request to his office by August 1st in order to be added to the 2024 edition and be part of this year's ceremony.

716-858-6787. "I think it is important to honor the brave men and women who have served and sacrificed for our

Country. They deserve to be recognized and I am pleased we can maintain a record of our local military heroes at the Erie County Clerk's Office", stated Kearns.

Kearns established the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients Book of Merit in 2018 and has committed to add to the book each year with new recipients, which is now in its sixth year. The book is named after Buffalo native and leading

advocate for the Central Intelligence Agency, William J. Donovan. Donovan would receive three Purple Hearts during his service in the military, and would go on to heard the predecessor of the CIA, during World War II.

The complete volume of the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit is on display yearround at the Erie County Clerk's Office in Old County Hall located at 92 Franklin Street, Buffalo. It presently holds five hundred forty (540) names of those honored with the Purple Heart from Erie County. The Purple Heart

Heart is the oldest military decoration awarded to members of the United States military who were wounded or killed while serving, on or after April 5, 1917. Originally called the Badge of Military Merit, the Purple Heart was created by George Washington on August 7, 1782. In addition to receiving a purple heart shaped award, the honoree's name and regiment were inscribed in a "Book of Merit" which was lost after the Revolutionary War and the award was largely forgotten until

over 100 years later.

Kearn's will recognize the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Recipients and honor all Purple Heart veterans during a ceremony on Wednesday, August 7th which also serves as National Purple Heart Day annually. Complete ceremony details will be made available as the event date approaches.

In addition, Old County Hall will be lit up purple, August 5-11th, in honor of Purple Heart Appreciation Day and in solemn recognition of all service members injured or killed in action.


Include your friend or family member in your plans—let them know you are thinking about them.

"Job loss, financial troubles and debt, unstable housing, food insecurity, social isolation, substance use and other serious or chronic medical conditions - these are common situations that can overwhelm and leave people living in crisis mode," said Erie County Commissioner of Health Dr. Gale Burstein. "Mental health has parallels with physical health. Some people can manage a health condition without the need for treatment and with no disruption to their activity; other people - most of us - can benefit from support."

"We have the capacity and the responsibility to watch out for each other, to prioritize meaningful conversations, and to have empathy for the people in our lives," said Crisis Services President and CEO Jessica Pirro. "Stigma around mental health conditions, barriers to mental health treatment and care, and perceptions that a person can 'tough it out' can lead to unnecessary and preventable suffering. Sharing reminders during Mental Health Awareness Month about the resources available to individuals can help keep this topic at the top of mind for our community."




