Then the familiar National Anthem is sung from the voice of a woman, who reminds us all of the freedom we have to play Sports and gather as families in a public Park during the Summer months.

While the League takes a break for the holiday, several teams in each Division could make for interesting Playoff competition in this Month of July.

In Major Boys, the Giants have finished the regular season undefeated with a 12-0 record on the strength of Jack Kleeh, Brian Bartels, Ben Auerbach and Sebastian Fyda. Seven other teams are try-

ing to hang on like the Padres, Braves or Reds but their key may be coming from the bench in the form of Jim Boyack, who at one time used to coach his

two sons in this same League years ago.

der Mann lead the Dodgers but a 4-8 record now doesn't match the type of play the MLB Dodgers have in Los Angeles. The Braves are playing good

Another undefeated team in the Park are the Rookie Girls Rebels. A great many of their girls returned to play this year after last season and they have put that behind them. The team has won against all seven other teams in the Division and is getting superb play from a different girl each week. Take this past week for example. Emma Filadora went three for three at the plate and scored two runs while teammate Blake Kurtz added two big hits in a 9-2 win over the Comets last Monday night. The victory was the Rebels eleventh in a row with a tie. Teams like the Devils or Diamonds aren't looking forward to playing the Rebels just yet.

In Double AA Girls, the Bears won their first game

of the season this past Saturday over the Razorbacks, 10-2. They're learning the game each week and after nine straight losses, this could be the start of a new season in the Playoffs. Anna Senulis, Autumn Schoos and Zahara Kyser each had multiple hits at the plate for the Huskies to help lead them to a 10-9 win over the Buckeyes in another Major Girls game.

J.J. Spatz of the Twins celebrated his birthday Saturday with a huge triple and was knocked in by teammate Dante Taylor to lead the Minnesota team to a 7-0 win over the Rays. Taylor was two for three and scored two runs while Spatz had three hits on the day.

The victory was only the team's second one of the year but they're learning fast against teams like the Guardians, Mariners or

Rangers.

Wes Polster blasted a solo homerun for the Braves in the fourth inning to a big win over the Reds in Major Boys. Gaedyn Burt had two hits, including an RBI single to lead the Phillies to a 6-3 win over the Pirates in Senior Boys. Oscar Siddel pitched the last two innings in relief.

The Mets defeated the Brewers, 11-2 in Double AA Boys on a two run homerun in the fourth by Liam Lundquist, knocking in Porter Lang. Lang went three for three at the plate while teammate Mateo Camp had a big triple.



Dear Rusty: If a financially well-off individual had multiple ex-spouses, could it happen that the multiple ex-spouses could each be collecting Social Security based on their own financial situation as compared to their rich ex-spouses? Just curious, because there are probably many people in this situation as a result of the ever-increasing number of people in-volved in multiple marriages that each lasted more than ten years.



Buffalo Zoo Welcomes New Otter

-The Buffalo Zoo is thrilled to announce the arrival of Cedrick, a male North American river otter who joins us through a breeding recommendation from the Association of Zoos and Aquariums' (AZA) Species Survival Plan (SSP).

Cedrick, born on February 7, 2022, at the Milwaukee County Zoo in Wisconsin, is just over three years old. He has come to Buffalo to be paired with our two resident female otters, Mindy (5) and Poppy (4), as part of a collaborative effort to support the longterm health of the species. Cedrick is currently acclimating to his new surroundings in the Zoo's Otter Creek habitat and has been settling in beautifully. Guests may already spot him swimming, sliding, and playfully exploring the exhibit. Keepers describe him as laid back and confident. He also has already shown signs of curiosity toward Mindy and Poppy, though the trio has not yet been formally introduced.

Over the coming weeks, Cedrick will continue to rotate on exhibit with Mindy and Poppy as he becomes more comfortable in his new environment. Gradual introductions will follow, with the goal of a successful future breeding partnership.

The North American river otter is no longer considered a threatened species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), thanks in part to decades of conservation progress.

While currently listed as a species of least concern, efforts like the Species Survival Plan (SSP) continue to play a vital role in maintaining healthy, genetically diverse populations in human care. The species faced significant decline in the early 20th century due to fur trapping and habitat loss, but conservation programs, improved water quality regulations, and reintroduction initiatives have helped otter populations rebound across much of their native range.

Organizations like the Buffalo Zoo remain committed to these strategies to ensure the species' longterm stability.

In the wild, North American river otters can be found across the eastern and northwestern United States-including here in Western New York—as well as throughout large parts of Canada.
