## East Side Garden Walk 2025

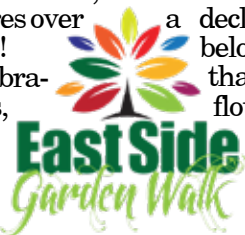

## Carnevale Leads Blaze To 10U Championship Victory!



Ten year old Christian Carnevale displays the huge ring he and his teammates received for winning the Championship July 3rd after defeating the Eden Raiders, 7-5. Team Manager John Catanzaro put all his trust in his star pitcher.

"I used my cutter, my fast-ball and my circle change to strike out those Eden players in the last innings of the game. My defense did really good."

Those were the words spoken last week by 10 year old Christian Carnevale, a pitcher on the 10U North Buffalo Blaze yellow team, coached by John Catanzaro, when they travelled to the Southtowns to take on the number 1 seed Eden Raiders for the WNY Premier League Mike Trout Division Bracket Championship. The Blaze started strong, building a 6-run lead after four innings and held off a late charge by Eden for a 7-5 victory.

Henry Zepper was the star of the game for the Blaze. He started the game on the mound and pitched a 3-inning gem, surrendering only two hits and giving up zero runs, while driving the middle of batting order as well, going 2-3 with 2 RBIs. The Raiders grabbed the momentum in the bottom half of the 5th and started mounting a comeback by scoring a couple of runs and loading the bases with no outs.

That is when Catanzaro turned to his most trusted arm, Christian Carnevale, a player who has been with the coach since T-Ball, to try and halt Eden's momentum. Carnevale rewarded the coaches trust by getting by getting out of the inning by giving up only one hit, maintaining a comfortable 3-run cushion for the team heading into the last inning. The young hurler closed out the bottom of the 6th with relative ease to secure the save and the title for the Blaze.

While a Finals win is usu-

ally reward enough, this one was made all the more special for Christian and the coaching staff because his grandfather, longtime North Buffalo Senior division coach, Babe Ruth coach, AAABA manager, NCCC head coach, and Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame member Robert Carnevale Sr. was in the stands, cheering on the team and providing a little bit of coaching advice along the way.

"Having someone with as much experience and Baseball knowledge as Mr. Carnevale supports this team is a real joy, but also a tremendous advantage for us every time he comes out," commented Catanzaro. "He'll give a member of our coaching staff a small piece of advice, a couple times a game that usually winds up being a critical adjustment needed for our team's success on the field."

Jay Randazzo, also part of the coaching staff that includes Carrie Phillips and Bobby Carnevale (Christian's father and Bob Sr. 's son), played for Bob Sr. and echoed Catanzaro's comments, getting choked up when discussing the win. "It was incredibly special watching Christian run directly over to his Grandfather after the game to share the moment and an embrace. Then, getting to watch my son Michael, celebrate with Bobby's boy almost 35 years after we celebrated big wins as teammates on Babe Ruth teams, and to do it with Mr. Carnevale, our coach for those teams looking on, made the moment truly magical."

Phillips summed it up best afterward, "There is a culture on this team that perfectly captures the essence of Shoshone Park and the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League that I think is almost entirely due to the fact that you have three generations of North Buffalo Baseball represented on the diamonds and in the bleachers each and every time our teams come to a Park."

Congratulations 2025 10U Blaze Yellow and Congratulations to Robert Carnevale Sr. who is still making an impact on the lives of North Buffalo players and their families after all these years.

Playoffs began last Monday in all eight House Divisions and are in full swing, with some teams being eliminated already. Giovanni Boitschenko, Llewyn Hettich, J.J. Hettich, J.J. Spatz and Dante Taylor all had multiple hits at the plate for the Twins, as they

won their first Playoff game, 6-5 over the Rays in Rookie Boys. Connor Whelan knocked in Evan Scott with the winning run in extra innings for an 8-7 Twins victory over the Angels in Triple AAA and the Blue Jays topped the Royals, 10-2 in another game.

K.J. McArdle of the Rookie Boys Angels moved up to help the Double AA Phillies defeat the Cardinals, 5-2 with two big hits and an RB in a first round Playoff game. Byron Smith tripled and had two RBIs as the team moved on to face the Mets. The Cardinals surprised the Mets, 9-7 in Major Boys under the lights on Diamond one and the Athletics defeated the Phillies 15-8 in Senior Boys at McCarthy Park.

Patrick Romanowski and Carter Tronolone and Ben Smith led the Triple AAA Mariners to a 13-10 victory over the White Sox. Gerald Nance got his first big hit of the season, a triple and teammate Jayden Ocasio had two hits to help lead the Padres to a 9-3 victory over the Dodgers in a Major Boys game under the lights on Diamond one. The Diamonds defeated the Angels, 8-1 and the Comets won over the Shamrocks, 7-2 in Rookie Girls.

Mia Batson played well defensively for the Bonnies and teammate Royalty Watts tripled in the 4th inning for the Bonnies in a 3-2 victory over the Razorbacks. Grayson King hit a grand slam homerun and teammates Jabari Pearson and Michael Della Selva added two more homeruns to help lead the Rookie Boys Orioles to a 15-14 win over the Jays. In Triple AAA, the Athletic's Cayden Langston knocked in teammate Henry Wilson in extra innings for a 5-4 victory over the Blue Jays. Liam Roehl hit a three run homer to lead the Rookie Boys Royals to a 11-5 win over the Guardians.

Zoe Roberts, Flossie Pyne and Addy Miller had key hits and played well defensively for the Ravens this past Saturday in a 3-1 victory over the Shamrocks. Mariel Jacob hit a walk off double for the Crimson Tide to win the game over the Volunteers, 7-6. The Double AA Pirates have won two games in a row. Saturday, Taamir McCrae pitched well over two innings in an 8-0 shutout of the Cardinals then, Andrew Szymanski and Luke Benz both homered in a 9-0 shutout win over the Braves.

Dean Riordan, Colin Kleeh and Jacob Fuerst helped lead the Triple AAA Yankees to a 9-5 win over the Athletics. Jordan Sabia, Jayce Ernst and Teddy Baker all came up big in a key playoff game. Victoria Perez and and Vienna Letzelter both had three hits for the Rebels as the team kept their undefeated season going in a big win over the Diamonds. Sadly, just ten teams have been eliminated from the playoffs at this writing in a field that numbers 65.

## What Is The Formula For Deciding When To Claim? - Ask Rusty

**Dear Rusty:** I am curious about the “formula” to decide when to take Social Security while still working. I am past the Full Retirement Age. How do you best address such? Should we schedule a call? **Signed: Wondering When**

**Dear Wondering:** Well, you can always contact us by phone on 1-888-750-2622 to speak to one of our certified Social Security Advisors, or you can send your questions to us via email at SSadvisor@amacfoundation.org. You don’t need to pre-schedule a meeting, as we have multiple advisors answering the phone on most normal business days. If they all happen to be busy when

you call, simply leave a voicemail and an Advisor will return your call promptly.

For starters, since you have reached your full retirement age, know that your work earnings will no longer negatively affect your Social Security benefits. You can earn as much as possible, and your monthly SS amount will be the same, based on your average lifetime monthly earnings (for your highest 35 years), and based on your age when you claim. Since you have not yet claimed SS, you are already earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) which increase your monthly SS amount by .667% for each month you continue

to delay. That’s 8% for each full year you delay past your full retirement age (FRA). You should not, however, wait longer than age 70 to claim because that is when you will get your maximum SS benefit amount. For you, that means that your age 70 amount will be 28% more than the amount you would have received at your FRA of 66 years and 6 months (in Oct. 2023), and about

15% more than if you were to claim now.

Note too, that if your more recent income is among the highest of your lifetime, Social Security will automatically increase your monthly SS retirement amount to account for that event. They will check your work earnings each year to see if you are entitled to a larger SS amount because of your recent earnings.

Since (according to your AMAC member record) you are married, you may also wish to consider whether your

wife will get a spousal benefit from you when you claim. If your wife’s personal SS retirement amount at her FRA is less than the amount you were entitled to at your FRA, then she will get a spousal boost when you claim. With her spousal boost (if claimed at her FRA), her total SS benefit should be about 50% of your FRA benefit amount (not half of the higher amount you will get because you waited longer to claim). But your wife cannot get a spousal boost until you are collecting your SS.


