

'This is unbelievable,'' she said, watching the game from behind home plate. "I'm so happy to be here, watching these kids battle for a championship.

This is great." The eight year old Phillies team showed the State

Senator how they played Baseball this Summer in North Buffalo with a total team effort from top to bottom of the lineup. The Philadelphia team got key hits from Trotter, Byron Smith and Jackson Sullivan, all season long and showed a resiliency against six other teams in a Division that was unpredict-

to six runs in all as able at times. Playing the Phillies won the control of the Brayes. Brewthe Braves, Brewers, Cardinals, Dodgers, Mets and last twelve games, in-

cluding the Playoffs for a 10-4-2 record on the season and the Championship in a competitive field.

Team Manager Jude Butch worked with these twelve boys, moving them around the order and out on the diamonds. Players like Byron Smith, Jack Sullivan, Clayton Pursel and Max Insalaco formed a pitching staff that kept opponents off the basepaths while teammates like Declan McCabe, Omeir Cannon, Teddy Hilligas or Jack Butch made plays defensively on the diamond. "Declan was very instrumental for us all season long, said Butch afterward. "He wasn't there for the Championship game but this win is just as much for him as well."

"Everyone contributed for us in some way," continued Butch. "Whether it was a clutch hit or a catch in the outfield, they learned to play a position out on the diamond and made contact with the baseball at bat. I think we surprised people at the end of the season.'


The Phillies got off to a slow start in early May when the season opened. They lost three of their first five games and played two ties with the Braves and the Brewers. The team never gave up however and kept working before their first win, a 6-5 victory over the Cardinals.

The victory was the spark that set off five more wins and just one more loss. With a 6-4-2 mark at the end of the regular season, the team got ready for the Playoffs and were ceded third in the Double AA Bracket.

"I want to thank these three men for helping me with this team," he said. "They are Ben Hilligas, Sam Insalaco and Aiden Pursel. If I wasn't able to be at one of our games, they stepped up and led us to victories this season and I appreciate it. The boys really played well.'

In the Playoffs, the Phils defeated the Cardinals in round one, 5-3 in early July. Four days later, the team gave the Mets their first loss in the Playoffs with a 9-8 win that set up a meeting with the #1 cede Brewers. They were ready for them too with a 1-0 victory that set the team up for a rematch with the Mets five days later for the Championship win.

Other players on this team are Luca Fanara, Keating Obletz and Cameron Spearman. Congratulations to the maroon and white colored Phillies in the Hertel North Park Youth Baseball League.

Defendant Assaults Victim With Frying Pan Over Barking Dog

How Do I Apply for Social Security and Receive my Payments? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: ready to apply for my Social Security benefits, and I'm aware of how my benefits are calculated. What I would like to know about is how the application process actually works and how my benefits are received. Signed: Ready to Collect

Dear Ready to Collect: Essentially, you have two main options for applying for Social Security benefits, and also two separate options for receiving your payments:

To apply for benefits, you can either contact Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 to make a telephone appointment to complete your applica-

tion while speaking to an SSA representative on the phone, or you can submit your application for SS benefits online.

When using the telephone option, you will be guided by an SSA agent while completing your application and can discuss your benefit options directly with that agent (just be sure to be available to receive SSA's call at the scheduled time). You can also make an appointment by calling your local SS field office directly (get the number for your local SS office at this link: www.ssa.gov/ locator). It is not usually necessary to visit your local SSA office in person to apply.

If you are reasonably

proficient with computers, you can, instead, apply online, but you will first need to create your personal SSA account online at www. ssa.gov/myaccount. Once you have your personal account set up, you will be able to see your estimated benefit amount at different claim ages, which should help you decide when it is best to apply. Here is a short video which explains the process for applying for benefits online: www. ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim_ r01.

If applying online, you can start your online application at www.ssa.gov/ apply and re-access it multiple times as needed until you are ready to submit it; just be sure to write down the "reentry code" which is provided when you begin your online application.

When you are ready to submit the application, just select "Submit" and your application will be sent to SSA's application processing unit for review. They will contact you if there are any questions about your application, or if any additional documentation is needed. Note that it typically takes a couple of months for your payments to start and note that payment is made in the month following the month earned. For example, if you begin your benefits in August your first payment will be received in September (on either the 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Wednesday of each month thereafter, depending on your birthday).

For receiving your monthly SS payments: you will (on you application) be able to specify how you wish your monthly payments to be made. The preferred option used by most beneficiaries is to have your monthly Social Security payment deposited into a financial (e.g., bank) account, details for which you will specify when applying. However, you can also choose to receive your monthly payments in the form of a debit card (called "Direct Express") which will be replenished monthly. If you choose to have your payment deposited in your bank account, be sure to have your bank account information ready when you apply. Note that Social Security no longer issues payments via printed checks (except in rare circumstances).




