

Assailant Attacks Dollar Tree Employee With 2 Liters Of Orange Soda



Why Hasn't My SS Benefit Changed Because I Am Still Working? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I am currently receiving Social Security benefits while continuing to work full time. There are no restrictions on my wage earnings because I waited until full retirement age before beginning benefits. However, I was also told that my benefit amount would be reviewed each year if my current earnings were higher than past earnings. That held true for the first two years but has yet to be adjusted for 2025. I thought it might be because of HR 82, which does not impact me directly, but I think it may be the reason my payment has not yet been changed. Has enough time passed so I should contact SSA now to see if this is the case? Signed: Waiting Anxiously

Dear Waiting: If you are already collecting benefits, Social Security reviews your earnings each year to see if your more recent earnings are high enough to warrant an increase in your monthly benefit. They do this automatically, after they get your most recent earnings data from the IRS, and they typically do that review by the end of the 3rd quarter of each year. If a higher benefit is indicated, they will increase your monthly amount and pay you retroactively to the beginning of the year for any difference in your benefit.

SSA has, indeed, been vigorously working changes resulting from HR82 (the Social Security Fairness Act), which may have affected the timeliness

of their review of your recent earnings. However, I suspect that is not why your SS benefit has not yet changed. More likely, it has to do with the fact that your past earnings have been adjusted for inflation (which is a normal part of Social Security's process when calculating your benefit amount). Your earnings for each year in your lifetime (up to age 60) were adjusted for inflation when you originally claimed SS, and your recent earnings would need to be higher than the inflation-adjusted amounts used by SS when you claimed. They use the 35 highest earnings years (adjusted for inflation) over your lifetime to calculate your benefit, and inflation has a substantial effect. For example, \$50,000 earned in 1990 would require over \$100,000 in earnings today to cause an increase in your benefit. Thus, you cannot go by the actual dollars you earned in earlier years, because SS uses inflated amounts to calculate your

In any case, if you believe that the Social Security Administration neglected reviewing your earnings from last year, or in any

benefit.

year since you claimed, you can make an appointment to review that with them by calling 1-800-772-1213. SSA typically does such appointments over the phone, so you likely won't need to make a personal visit to your local SSA office to investigate this.



Continued from page one. Park. Wearing navy blue jerseys with red lettering and matching TC caps, these 13 boys jumped in the air and rushed towards each other when the final out was made to end a magical season.

"We only had two players that returned from last year's team, said Sullivan, earlier this sea-

son, "and the rest were new players up from T-Ball.

They learned the set worth Park ing in the in the the R They learned to hit the ball and then win the games.

It was a slow, painful process when the season started, with two

ties among six losses until early June. Sullivan kept the boys focused on hitting a baseball and getting on base. Some players were catching on like Dante Taylor, Ğiovanni Boitschenko and Nate Balsano but Sullivan was patient, even with Oliver Dunbar, a first year player, to watch the Twins grow. The team won its first game Saturday, June 14 in a big win over the Astros and the season got brighter. Three games

later, the Twins finished the regular season with a 2-8-2 record, and were ceded fifth in the Playoff bracket of seven teams.

Players like J.J. Spatz, Llewyn Hettich, Clark Liwosz, Finley Toft and James Sullivan joined Taylor, Boitschenko and Balsano to form a "hitting machine" against any opponent stand-

ing in their way in the Playoffs. topped the Rays, 6-5 in round one on July $7 \mathrm{th}$ before meeting a tough White Sox team five days later.

Spatz and teammate Owen Tashjian brought their bats with them along with Taylor, Boitschenko and Balsano. A hard-fought 8-7 victory moved the Twins into the semi-finals against the Yankees a week later.

'These Boys never gave up," said Sullivan afterward. "They all worked hard and listened well when I talked to them. I was happy to see how excited they got. These are good players."

Against the Yankees, the Twins exploded for 11 runs across the plate when Boitschenko led off the game with a solo homerun in the first inning and went two for three at the plate. Tashjian had three hits and Balsano added two hits and made a great play at first base.

That set up the Championship against the Angels, played on Diamond one last Wednesday night. 




