The Buffalo History Museum is offering free guided tours of the Waterway of Change exhibit every Saturday at 1:00 PM. The guided tour will last about 40-45 minutes and is limited to 20 guests. This exhibit invites visitors to explore the transformative story of the Erie Canal. It begins with the traditional Haudenosaunee and the canal's opening in 1825, tracing how it helped turn Buffalo into a bustling port and shipping hub by the late 19th century.

It also highlights the diverse perspectives of Indigenous Peoples, Black individuals, women, and immigrant communities

affected by the canal's development, offering a richer understanding of its cultural and historical significance.

Through an interactive multimedia experience featuring short films, touchscreens, audio, historical artifacts, and dramatic lighting, visitors of all ages and abilities will discover Buffalo's rapid transformation, the technical innovations behind the canal, and the vital contributions of individuals to the city's development.

Man Steals 4 Credit Cards And Makes Charges Over \$500.00

North Buffalo November 3, 2025
Delaware Avenue - During a physical altercation the defendant did grab the victim's breast causing bruising and scratches while screaming obscenities and threatening to sexually assault victim. Fearing for her physical safety, the victim locked herself in her office until police arrived. Victim is seeking order of protection as she works in his group home.

November 2, 2025
Norwalk Avenue - The co-defendant did cross onto the complainant's property and did engage the complainant in an aggressive manner after an argument. The defendant did strike the complainant multiple times on the head and face causing visual bruising and physical injury to his face and head. The complainant also complains of shoulder pain. The co-defendant was issued a roadside appearance ticket to appear in Buffalo City Court. Video footage exists of the incident and is recorded on patrol officers body worn camera. The complainant was evaluated by AMR for his injuries.

November 1, 2025
Hertel Avenue - The defendant entered victim's property without permission by walking up to the driveway to the rear of the home where a New York registered vehicle was parked. The defendant appears to have a keyfob belonging to the vehicle which was taken during a previous incident. Defendant unlocked the parked vehicle and took 4 credit cards belonging to the victim. A short time later, the defendant used the stolen credit cards to make purchases at Wegmans, 601 Amherst Street, TOPS, 345 Amherst Street, and Home Depot, 2100 Elmwood Avenue. The total financial loss to the victim exceeded \$500.00. Video of the incident and uses of the credit cards collected by detective and obtained by supporting deposition.

October 31, 2025
Ontario Street - The de-

fendant did engage in tumultuous and threatening behavior towards the public and made obscene gestures. The defendant also made threats to shoot an officer in the face.

October 31, 2025
Delaware Avenue - Officers responded to accident with injury on Delaware Avenue. Defendant was operating vehicle northbound in the southbound lanes of the S-curves and struck two other vehicles that were traveling southbound in southbound lanes. When officers were investigating accident, defendant did admit to operating said vehicle. Officers observed glassy red eyes, impaired speech, strong odor of alcoholic beverage from defendant. Defendant did admit to officers on scene that she was coming from Mother's Bar/Restaurant and had one martini on scene. In AIU office she stated to officers she had two martinis. Elmwood Avenue - Defendant did use an old receipt to match SKU #'s on candy inside 5Below while also placing said items in her purse. 5 candies were attempted to be returned by defendant and defendant did also take without permission 1 pink mug, 1 earphones, and 1 energy drink. Estimated transaction \$17.45. Merchandise returned by patrol officer.

Consider the “Wearing Out” Factor While Deciding When to Claim Social Security - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: Enjoyed your recent article on claiming SS benefits. I feel, however, any decision making should also include what I call the “wearing out” factor. Yes, financial need, health, and longevity are definite criteria for a decision. The inevitable problem (I just turned 83) is the speed at which many of us descend down the back side of that hill after we hit around age 65. Yes, one might live to 85-90 but as you age after 65, many physical limitations begin to appear. Only then does one realize their earlier retirement decision (waiting to max out SS) might not have been honestly evaluated to the extent

needed. I speak from experience: after having reached 60 in excellent health, I took early retirement from work, then Social Security at 62, and glad I did so. I figure the degree of slope on the backside of that “hill” will increase with age (it did quickly for me), so one best start enjoying a retirement life as soon as financially possible. **Signed: Glad I claimed at 62**
Dear Glad I Claimed at 62: Thank you very much for your excellent perspective on the “wearing out” factor. And please know that I wholeheartedly concur with your opinion that waiting for a higher Social Security benefit is

not always the most prudent choice. For perspective, however, we have found that far too many people claim Social Security as soon as they are eligible at 62 simply because “it is there,” without fully analyzing whether that is the best option considering their personal circumstances.

You are correct – enjoying your retirement life while you are still physically able is a valid consideration. And that is why we always suggest that evaluating both your financial needs as well as your health and life expectancy is important. Fulfilling one’s “bucket list” is, indeed, an important consideration and if claiming Social Security at age 62 (after evaluating all factors) enables one to do that, then that is exactly the right choice. It obviously was for you.

Age does, indeed, tend to slow us down, so if taking the SS money early means being able to enjoy life while you still can, then that is a good decision. But having more money as you age can also make your “golden years” a lot more comfortable. As we have recently witnessed, inflation has an insidious way of reducing our financial comfort in retirement. Despite having a retirement pension from your primary working career, imagine how another 25% in your monthly Social Security payment (had you claimed at full retirement age instead of age 62) would help make your senior years more comfortable.

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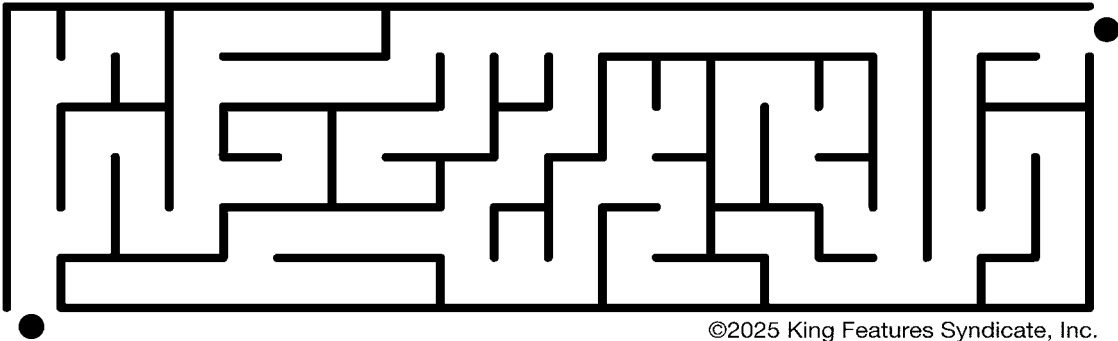
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Kids' Maze

Admission is a suggested donation of \$20 to benefit Ars Nova.

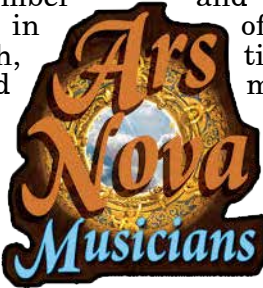
The Choir of St. Louis Church is an all-volunteer ensemble. Its members rehearse each

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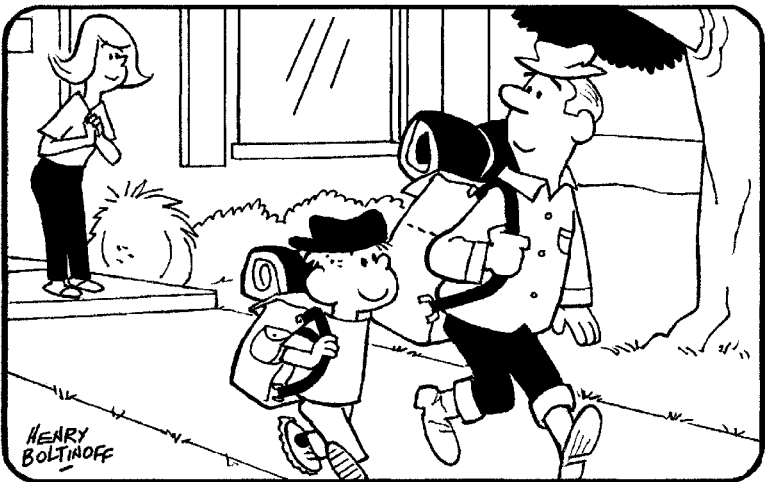
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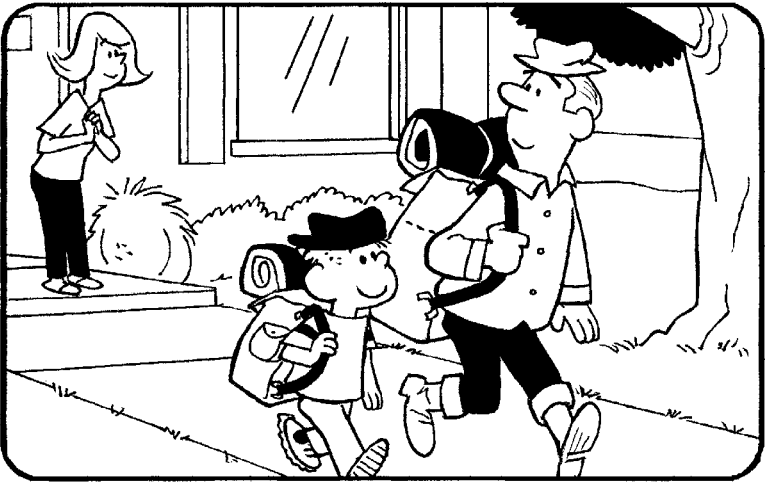

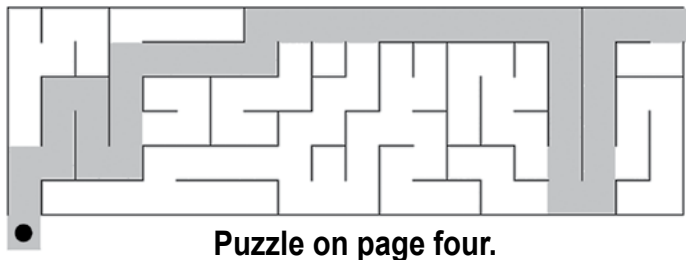
