

#### Why Won't Social Security Give Me My Benefits? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I called the Social Security of-fice, as well as went with my husband when he went to collect his Social Security. Because I work full-time (at about \$800/ week), they said I could not file for my Social Security. Yet I seem to read articles all the time about people doing so.

My husband just filed for his benefits and is now collecting them. Out of the two of us, his Social Security will be larger. Please advise me. Signed: Wanting my Benefits

Dear Wanting my Benefits: If you have not yet reached your SS  $full\ retirement\ age\ (FRA)$ and you are working fulltime, you are likely being affected by Social Security's Annual Earnings Test, which limits how much you can earn while collecting Social Security prior to your FRA. Your FRA is somewhere between 66 and 67, depending on when you were born. The annual earnings limit for those collecting SS benefits prior to FRA in 2025 is \$23,400 (changes yearly) and, if that is exceeded, Social Security will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. If you applied for your benefits and are still working, and were denied, it's likely because Social Security determined that your current annual earnings considerably exceed the earnings limit and, thus, you cannot collect

benefits. That's because the penalty for exceeding the limit would be more than your benefit amount. FYI, the earnings limit will go away when you reach your full retirement age, so after FRA, you can claim your benefits even if you are still working. Or if you stop working before your FRA, you can collect your SS benefits at that time.

None of this means you are losing money, because your monthly SS payment will continue to grow until you later claim (e.g., after you stop working, or only work part-time), or until you reach 70 years of age. When you later claim, your monthly benefit will be higher, and depending on your longevity, you may recover what you didn't get now because you are working. And that includes both your own SS retirement benefit and any spousal boost you may be entitled to from your husband.

So, my suggestion is this: as long as you are working full-time and exceeding Social Security's annual earnings limit, continue to wait to claim your Social Security. Then, when you reach your full retirement age (again, between 66 and 67, depending on the year you were born), or if you stop working before that, go ahead and apply for Social Security again. At that time, your application will be approved, and you will be awarded your own earned SS retirement amount plus any additional amount you may be due as your husband's spouse. To be entitled to a spousal boost from your husband, your own FRA entitlement must be less than 50% of your husband's FRA entitlement. But the amount you get will be reduced if you claim before your full retirement age.

### Hanna



Hanna, my housemaid.

Since my wife passed away four years ago, being that I have a house bigger than I need, I have had to hire cleaning people to help keep it clean. We did have a cleaning lady who would come periodically even when my wife was still alive. I did have her come but really was not

satisfied with her work. The last time she came she brought her husband to help as she said she was too tired. So, I looked for another cleaning person and ended up with a oncea-month cleaning service. Different cleaning people every month and not so good. One person they sent worked for about one and a half hours, you must pay for three regardless and was leaving without vacuuming the rugs. Seven rooms with rugs and having just returned from five months in Florida, the rugs needed cleaning. I asked why she did not do the rugs and her answer was "They looked clean".

Problem is, down in Florida I have a much smaller house and a Mexican lady who cleans. I mean she cleans. She kind of spoiled me as now that is what I expect from a person hired to clean. I did not get that up north from my American born cleaners. The difference was significant. So now comes Hanna.

Being that I insist on living in my house and being as I am old, I do need assistance. My one daughter, who is always at my side, suggested I get a helper once a week. Since I was able to function alright I kind of fought it for whatever reason. My daughter happens to oversee a school that teaches refugees to speak English. Refugees are escaping some form of disaster where immigrants come out of choice. My daughter had met a woman who was from Ukraine and was looking for a one day a week job to fill her schedule as she worked the other four. I met her and decided to give it a try.

Little background into Hanna. She had 12 kids, six of her own and six adopted. Tells what kind of woman she is. Her husband was in the construction business and had built a beautiful house in eastern Ukraine for the family. Then the Russians invad-

ed and took their house. They had nothing left. So, the family that was still home escaped to the US as refugees. The one son is in the Ukrainian army fighting the Russians, the older married children fled to Western Ukraine and are still there.

So now Hanna comes once a week and helps me with housework. Laundry, bedding and cleaning. The work ethics between non-Americans and Americans is staggering. At least in this capacity. I have had both. Now I am spoiled and want a Hanna in Florida. A once-a-week helper. I like being fussed over. Especially at my age. Imagine working your life for something and then having it taken away? God Bless America. Appreciate what we have.
