## SPCA Winter Pet Safety Tips



Plan ahead for the upcoming snowy days and nights now to ensure your pets stay safe and healthy today and throughout the rest of the winter.

It had to happen sometime! The snow is back, and as many veterinary clinics (including the Lipsey Veterinary Clinic at the SPCA) are dealing with smaller work forces, it's a little more complicated to receive emergency veterinary care. Plan ahead for the upcoming snowy days and nights now to ensure your pets stay safe and healthy today and throughout the rest of the winter. Read on for some of the SPCA Serving Erie County's winter pet safety tips.

\*Outdoor Animal Shelter Must Be Suitable For Inclement Weather: ...and if it's not, animal welfare of-



ficers can rescue the pet even before he or she shows signs of suffering, thanks to New York State's Shelter Law that went into effect in 2003. Thanks to a legislative push in late 2018 that led to stronger laws concerning the tethering of dogs within Buffalo city limits, the SPCA and other law enforcement organizations can now take even more steps to ensure dogs are protected from the elements.

\*Keep a Tight Leash: Never let your dog off the leash on snow or ice, especially during a snowstorm. Pets can lose their scent on snow and ice, especially if snow is falling at

a fast rate, and your pet can easily lose his sense of direction. Pets may also panic during a snowstorm and run away; many pets are lost during the winter months. Remember to keep current identification on your pet at all times!

\*Keep Pets At Home: Never leave your pet alone in a car during cold weather. A car can act as a refrigerator in the winter, holding in the cold. Your pet could literally freeze to death.

\*Always Dry Pet's Wet Feet: Thoroughly wipe off your pet's legs and stomach when she comes in and out of the rain, snow or ice. Check her sensitive foot pads, which may be bleeding from snow or ice encrusted in them. Your pet may also pick up salt and other chemicals. *Continued on page five.*



### Post New Years Crime Streak Down Hertel And Delaware Avenues

**North Buffalo**  
**January 5, 2025**  
Delaware Avenue - The defendant and two co-defendants did take without permission \$1020.00 worth of winter coats and pass all points of purchase. The subjects did flee when confronted by loss prevention and left in New York registered vehicle. Defendant identified by lieutenant.

**January 3, 2026**  
Hertel Avenue - Defendant was passenger of New York registered vehicle. Upon inventory search of vehicle prior to tow, officer did recover a clear tied off plastic baggie containing white rock like substance, consistent with crack cocaine inside a pill bottle with approximate weight of 6.8 grams along with a bottle with no label containing 600 milligrams Gabapentin. Officer did recover from right front pocket of defendant clear crystal in a plastic baggie with approximate weight of 1.2 grams consistent with crystal methamphetamine.

**January 3, 2026**  
Hertel Avenue - Defendant was operating New York registered vehicle westbound on Hertel and did pass the steady red light at Hertel at St. Florian directly in front of officers. Upon stop, defendant was operating on a revoked status. Upon search officer did recover a tied off plastic baggie containing white rock like substance, consistent with crack cocaine.

**January 1, 2026**  
Delaware Avenue - Defendant and co-defendant did enter and remain unlawfully at 1165 Delaware. Both defendants were observed on the 4th floor and apprehended on the 4th floor as well.

**December 31, 2025**  
Hertel Avenue - Defendant did pass all points of purchase concealing items totaling approximately \$20.00 without paying.

**West Side**  
**January 6, 2025**  
West Ferry Street - The victim attempted to have a conversation with the defendant who is her downstairs neighbor regarding an ongoing issue with the defendant's dog being off leash. The defendant became irate and stated, "B\*\*\*h, I'll f\*\*\*\*\*g kill you for talking to my husband."

After the victim went back upstairs to her apartment the defendant the began to bang on the victim's locked downstairs hallway door and was observed displaying a large kitchen knife placing the victim in fear for her safety. warrant signed by honorable judge. Upon executing search warrant, patrol officer did recover a Glock 43x with serial number loaded with 1 in the chamber and a loaded magazine from a black Adidas satchel in the attic. The defendant's actions were injurious to the two juvenile children that were at the residence. Evidence detective and photographer did respond.

**January 6, 2026**  
East Street - Officer while at directed patrol did get flagged down by employee at Family Dollar for male walking at same location. Male did take without payment 8 bottles of motor oil and did have same inside on his person when stopped. Merchandise was stuffed into jacket lining. All merchandise returned to store. Total \$45.68.

Ontario Street - Defendant did take 2 cans of Monster (\$6) without permission and did pass all points of purchase. Defendant apprehended at 136 Ontario Street and both cans of Monster were on defendant's person. Recovered by patrol officer in jacket pockets.

## Why Didn't My Friend's Wife Get All Her SS Immediately? - Ask Rusty

**Dear Rusty:** A friend told me about what he believes is a strange thing in the Social Security system. His wife reached her full retirement age (FRA) of 66 several years ago. She delayed filing for Social Security past her FRA and claimed on her 68th birthday in June of that year, exactly 2 years after her FRA. When she filed, she was told she would receive approximately \$300/month, which, of course, was more than she would have received at her FRA. She was told however that she would only receive \$300/month as of January 1 of the following year. Between June of the year she turned 68 and filed for SS until the end of that year, she would receive an amount less than

\$300. This lower amount was the amount she would have received if she had filed in December, the year she turned 67. She said she was told that was how SS works. She would never receive the difference in benefits she lost from June through December of the year she filed. If the above is true, can you explain? **Signed: Astounded Friend**

**Dear Astounded:** What your friend described is, indeed, a unique methodology for how Social Security handles benefit payments for those who choose to wait beyond their full retirement age (FRA) to claim SS benefits. To understand it, let me first describe how Social Security retirement benefits are calculated.

At full retirement age, a person is entitled to 100% of the SS benefit they have earned from a lifetime of working. That FRA benefit amount is known as the person's "Primary Insurance Amount" (PIA) and is based upon the highest earning 35 years over the individual's lifetime. From those past years, average lifetime monthly earnings are computed, known as the person's "Average Indexed Monthly Earnings" (AIME). Their AIME is subjected to a formula which yields their Primary Insurance Amount – the benefit the person is entitled to in the month they attain their full retirement age – typically about 40% of the person's average monthly lifetime earnings. However, if the person chooses to do so, they can wait beyond their FRA to claim Social Security to get a monthly benefit even higher than their PIA, by earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs).

DRCs are applied to the person's PIA when they claim Social Security. For each month after FRA the person claims, they will have .667% added to their PIA. That means that for each full year of delay, that person will get an extra 8% added to their PIA. For someone (like your friend's wife) who claimed 24 months after her FRA, she would receive a benefit 16% higher than her FRA amount. However, Social Security normally only applies DRCs in January of each year.

So, even though your friend's wife claimed her SS benefits in June, 24 months after her FRA, she would initially only get the DRCs she had accumulated through the end of the previous year – in this case, about 18 months' worth of DRCs, or an SS payment about 12% higher than her PIA (her FRA amount). She would not get her remaining earned DRCs (another 4%) until January of the following year. So, in effect, the wife's initial benefit didn't reflect all her earned DRCs until her later January benefit payment. Thus, the wife essentially lost that extra benefit money for the period between June and December of the year she claimed Social Security. In other words, she wouldn't get the full 16% amount until SS applied the additional 4% DRCs to her benefit payment the following January. And that is why your friend's wife initially received a payment a bit less than the \$300 Social Security said she was entitled to by waiting 2 years after her FRA to claim.

cals on her feet accidentally. These chemicals could hurt her if she swallows them while licking her feet.

**\*Lay Straw for Dogs' Visits Outdoors:** Can't get your dog to wear booties? Lay straw on top of snow for trips outdoors by dogs reluctant to step out onto a freezing surface to relieve themselves.

**\*Check Cars for Cats:** During the winter, stray or neglected cats outdoors sometimes sleep under the hood of the car where it's warm and comfortable. If you start the motor, cats could get caught in or flung about by the fan belt, causing serious injury or death. To prevent this, bang loudly on the hood and sides of your car before turning on the ignition to give the cat a chance to escape.

**\*Keep Outdoor Sessions Short:** Take your dog outside only for as long as it takes for him to relieve himself. Dogs,

particularly small, short-haired breeds like Chihuahuas and terriers, suffer from the cold despite their seemingly warm fur coats. Live within Buffalo city limits? Don't forget Buffalo's new laws pertaining to tethering dogs in inclement weather.

**\*Bathe Pets Only When Necessary:** Your pet runs the chance of catching a cold when wet, especially in cold weather. If you absolutely must bathe your pet, consult a professional groomer or veterinarian.

**\*Keep Pets Warm:** Limit the clipping of your pet's hair in the cold winter months, keeping your pet as warm as possible. Brush your pet daily in lieu of clipping to keep your pet's coat healthy, shiny, clean and mat-free. Make sure your pet has a warm place to sleep far away from outside drafts.

**\*Hungry Pets:** Speak to your veterinarian about increasing your

pet's supply of food, particularly protein, to keep his fur thick and healthy through the winter months. Inquire about vitamin and oil supplements.

**\*Antifreeze Is Poison To Pets:** Antifreeze, Even In Small Doses, Is A Lethal Poison For Dogs And Cats! Because of its sweet taste, animals are attracted to it. Be sure to clean up spills thoroughly, and consider switching to an animal-friendly antifreeze. Ensure that, if you store Antifreeze in a garage, shed, or other places accessible to your pets, it is well out of pets' reach.
