



Counting Down The Days!



Just inside the new Thomas M. Smith Athletic Center (TSAC) in Shoshone Park lies this beautiful, hand painted mural done to reflect the mission of this facility inside the City of Buffalo.

We're here in the new Thomas M. Smith Athletic Center (TSAC) in the middle of a cold, winter night in February to report that the phones have been ringing "off the hook" ever since this new facility has been open for the general public to come in and see for themselves just what has been made available for the City of Buffalo.

The General Manager of this fine facility, Ron Pilat and his new assistant, Sean Ryan, of North Buffalo have found themselves answering questions both in person and over the phone about the TSAC and how people could utilize this tremendous facility for use training and learning the game as soon as possible. Pilat and his small staff of North Buffalo residents are overseeing three batting cages and an expansive floor made of artificial turf that can be utilized for all athletes, either boys or girls in Baseball, Softball, Soccer and Lacrosse just to name a few of the sports that will be on tap in the coming months of a WNY Summer.

North Buffalo Baseball and Softball has been here since Day One in Shoshone Park, located at 475 Beard Avenue, just off the entrance to the Park. The huge green and white structure can be seen from anywhere inside the Park's boundaries as a new headquarters for the 68 year old League that has been in existence since 1957. The League has grown so much since those early days of afterschool baseball in the Summertime

in North Buffalo. With registration numbers of over 1,000 boys and girls playing in the Park since 2020 and the Covid-19 outbreak, members of the Board of Directors for the League at the time, had already begun talks of removing a dilapidated and seldom used City of Buffalo swimming pool at this very spot to help grow the league all year round in North Buffalo. Under the direction of Donald Morris, a longtime president of North Buffalo Baseball since the late 1980's, the board was approached by City of Buffalo Parks Department worker by the name of Tom Smith and an idea was born to create and build what we have today. The Don Morris Fields of Shoshone Park will surround this new building for many years to come.

To date, a great many organizations have already used the TSAC including the City of Buffalo Public School System. Late last fall, when the weather started turning for the worst, School's like Bennett and McKinley High were having winning seasons on the field at All-Robert E. Rich All-High Stadium nearby was in the midst of the playoffs. Both Schools utilized the TSAC in the preceding days in their quest for a Championship.

Another worthwhile North Buffalo youth organization using the TSAC at this time has been The Delaware Soccer Club, a huge League that uses many North Buffalo Parks to hold their games during their successful seasons.

The relationship between the Soccer League and the TSAC has already been called a success and it should continue in the foreseeable future.

With Opening Day set for Saturday, May 2, North Buffalo Baseball and Softball Board members and Coaches have been meeting regularly since January to get ready for the 2026 season. With just under 70 days left to Opening Day, the League is strongly urging all families to register as soon as possible to prevent NBBS from having to form "waiting lists" for boys and girls who have to wait until a spot is available for a certain Division or Team. The goal is to give any child, boy or girl the opportunity to play Baseball or Softball regardless of age, ability, race or finances the right to learn America's oldest pastime.

To find out more information about North Buffalo Baseball and Softball and the TSAC, click on www.hnpybl.com and hit the registration bar on its home page. There you will find a wealth of information on the League, history, organization, contact information and where and when games are played. Information about the TSAC can be found at smithathleticcenter.com. If your son or daughter has never played the game before or you are new to North Buffalo, this is one of your best ways to get to know your community. A Summer in North Buffalo and Shoshone Park have been the start of some of Buffalo's successful men and women working today and raising their families in all kinds of fields of labor. Some families watching their kids play today, got their start playing in this same League 20 or 30 years ago.

For the simple, one time cost of \$150.00, you will be paying the lowest amount of money to our League here in North Buffalo. Your son or daughter will play twice a week from May until the middle of July. Every team makes the Playoffs and no one goes home with tears in their eyes. So come home to Shoshone Park and "Play Ball!"


