Sports Huskies Win Again in Major Championship!

For the second year in a row, the Huskies won the Championship in the Major Girls Division of the North Buffalo Baseball Softball League in Shoshone Park late last month and they've been celebrating ever since.

Autumn Schoos and Sienna Smith, two twelve year old girls from last season's team, took the mound again this year and became a 1-2 punch on the mound to lead the Huskies and repeat as Champions in the six team, double elimination Playoffs.

They defeated a surprising Ducks team, 11-1 July 28th but they needed the entire team to pull it off.

Losing 1-0 in the bottom of the fourth inning in the Championship game, Gigi Barbosa was at the plate, looking to get on base and bring the top of the order to the Ducks. With teammates Harper Shaw and Irene Stief on base, the first year player and newcomer to Shoshone Park, connected with the softball this season for a base hit and turned the game around. Both Shaw

and Stief raced home to put the Huskies on top, 2-1 which led to the 11-1 final in a perfect season.

"It was a great game and a great season," said Manager Bob Schoos afterward. "I'm proud of these girls for showing up every game and being a part of this team. We had thirteen girls on the roster and they all just gave 100% out on the Diamond. I'm so happy for these girls."

Schoos has watched a number of girls play as one of the finest girls coaches over the last few years in North Buffalo Baseball and Softball. With his wife Janine and assistant coach Jeff Senulis, the Huskies have

put together two Championship winning seasons in the Major Girls Division with strong pitching on the mound and an offense that put runners on base. Anna Senulis batted third or forth in the order and always got on base. She played first base and caught the throws fired at her to keep the base clean. A throw from shortstop Zahara Kyser was always on time, making the

Huskies defense sharp around the diamond.

"It was a fun year," chimed Bob's daughter, Autumn. "Mr. Senulis was very passionate about our play, very upbeat and showed us how and why. He made us better players."

The Huskies put together nine straight wins during the regular season from early May until late June. That's when they battled another team, the Hokies, to a 9-9 tie, their only blemish on a 13-0-1 final record. Girls like Annmaree Alvarez, another newcomer to the team, blasted huge bombs into the outfield for numerous homeruns or stand-up triples. She caught for both Schoos or Smith on the mound and provided security behind the plate. Playing against teams like the Hokies, Griffis, Buckeyes or Bruins, the Huskies became the number one cede for the Double Elimination Playoffs. They awaited the winner of a Buckeyes/Bruins game in round one before they won three straight games to claim their second Championship.

Other girls on the team include Aracelis Pena, Jackie Adams, Gia Richardson, Devonna Harris and Aieryn Prewitt. It was an awesome line-up that saw scores become 11, 13 or even 15-3 or 5. For a Division that plays most of their games on Diamond #2 in Shoshone Park, the Huskies proved their team was second to none.

Except for the Senior Boys and Senior Girls Divisions, all eight other Divisions in the North Buffalo Baseball Softball League House teams have wrapped up their seasons as this goes to press. Championship games come and go quickly on any given night or weekend.

A smile on a boy or girls face after their coach hands them an individual trophy for helping win a Championship is genuine and from the heart. It's a precious moment in the life of a child, playing in a Park not far from home. Whether you're a Husky or a Yankee or Blue Jay, there's no losers in the North Buffalo Baseball Softball League in Shoshone Park.

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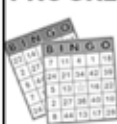

Kearns Proudly Pays Tribute To Purple Heart Recipients



Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns pays tribute to 48 Purple Heart Recipients being added to the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit for 2026 during a Dedication and Flag Raising Ceremony that included honorees, family members, veteran organizations, and the Military Order of the Purple Heart, Chapters 187 and 264.

As our nation commemorates America's 250th Anniversary, Erie County Clerk Michael P. Kearns marked National Purple Heart Day by honoring Erie County veterans whose names were added to the 9th Annual William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit for 2026.

The ceremony served as a reminder that the freedoms celebrated during America's 250th anniversary were secured through the



courage and sacrifice of generations of American servicemen and servicewomen. The Purple Heart itself traces its origins to the Revolutionary War, when General George Washington established the Badge of Military Merit on August 7, 1782—the predecessor to today's Purple Heart—making it the nation's oldest military decoration still awarded.

"While America celebrates 250 years of independence, it is fitting

that we remember those who paid the highest price to preserve the freedoms our nation was founded upon," said Kearns. "An estimated two million members of our Armed Forces have been killed or wounded in combat and earned the Purple Heart. These selfless Americans came from every walk of life, including communities throughout Erie County. Most veterans never ask for recognition, but I firmly believe they have earned our gratitude and our commitment to ensure their sacrifices are never forgotten."

National Purple Heart Day is observed annually on August 7 to honor members of the United States Armed Forces who were wounded or killed while serving our nation.

No formal record of Erie County Purple Heart recipients existed prior to 2018, when Kearns established the William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit, creating a permanent historical record maintained by the Erie County Clerk's Office.

"Creating this Book of Merit was one of the most meaningful initiatives of my tenure as County Clerk," Kearns said. "As the county's chief records officer, I believed we had both an opportunity and an obligation to preserve the names and stories of these extraordinary men and women for future generations."

With the addition of forty-eight (48) new honorees this year, the 2026 William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit now permanently recognizes 638 Purple Heart recipients from across Erie County.

The Book of Merit is named in honor of Buffalo native General William J.

Donovan, one of America's most decorated military leaders and widely regarded as the "Father of American Intelligence." Donovan served with distinction during World War I, earning three Purple Hearts before later leading the Office of Strategic Services (OSS), the predecessor to today's Central Intelligence Agency.

This year's ceremony was held in the Ceremonial Courtroom at Old County Hall and concluded with a Purple Heart flag-presentation ceremony inside the courtroom due to inclement weather. The program featured welcoming remarks from County Clerk Kearns, the Presentation of the Colors by the Gabriel A. Rodriguez American Legion Post 1928 Color Guard, the Pledge of Allegiance led by World War II veteran Dr. John Long, and the National Anthem performed by local lyricist George Miller. Kearns, joined by representatives of Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapters 187 and 264, presented

Certificates of Recognition and commemorative Purple Heart pins to recipients and their families as each veteran's name, branch of service, and conflict were read aloud.

The William J. Donovan Purple Heart Book of Merit is permanently displayed at the Erie County Clerk's Office inside Old County Hall, 92 Franklin Street, alongside historical photographs of General Donovan, his portrait, and a World War I-era Purple Heart with two oak leaf clusters donated to the Clerk's Office.

"As we celebrate 250 years of America, we are reminded that every generation has answered the call to defend our nation," Kearns added. "The Purple Heart represents extraordinary courage, sacrifice, and devotion to duty. Preserving the legacy of Erie County's Purple Heart recipients ensures their service will never be forgotten and that future generations will understand the true cost of the freedoms we enjoy."

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Is the Medicare Part B Premium a Percentage of our Social Security Amount? - Ask Rusty

Dear Rusty: I have a simple question: Is the amount we pay for Medicare Part B premium a percent of our Social Security amount we receive? **Signed: Curious**

Dear Curious:

Your Medicare Part B premium is not based on a percentage of your monthly Social Security benefit amount. Medicare Part B premiums are set in October of each year by CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) and are based upon anticipated total costs of the Medicare program in the forthcoming year. Generally speaking, Medicare Part B enrollee premiums are expected to offset about 25% of CMS' anticipated total Medicare Part B costs; the rest is borne by the Federal Government. So, when CMS estimates Medicare program costs for the upcoming year, they also look at the number of anticipated Part B enrollees. They then divide 25% of total anticipated Part B program costs by the number of expected Part B enrollees, resulting in the "standard" Medicare Part B premium for next year. For 2026, the standard Part B premium amount is \$202.90. The standard premium for 2027 will be announced in October 2026 and will likely be different.

It's important to understand also that not everyone pays the "standard" Part B premium. Some lower income seniors may pay less because of the so-called

"hold harmless provision," and some higher income folks may pay more than the "standard" monthly Part B premium because of a provision called "IRMAA."

The "hold harmless provision" says that monthly Social Security benefits cannot decrease as a result of a Medicare premium increase, so if the annual SS COLA (cost of living adjustment) is insufficient to offset any increase to the standard Part B premium, then the SS beneficiary may pay a smaller Part B premium amount so that their SS benefit doesn't decrease (note there are exceptions to this rule).

Conversely, those with a higher "provisional income" (an IRS definition), may pay more than the standard Medicare Part B premium. That's because of a provision known as "IRMAA" (Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount), which adds a supplemental amount on top of the standard Medicare Part B premium. IRMAA supplemental amounts are determined using a sliding scale to define the required higher Part B premium for each income level category, and IRMAA will cause the Part B premium to be more than the standard premium amount. For those with exceptionally high incomes, the Part B premium can be as much as \$690 per month.

FYI, income reported to the IRS two years ago is used to determine if an individual is subject to IRMAA for the forthcoming year.

The reason for this is timing: when next year's Part B premium is determined in October of each current year, the IRS has processed all tax returns for the preceding year but doesn't yet have individual income for the current year. Thus, they must use a person's income from October of the preceding year to determine who will pay the standard Part B premium next year, and who will pay a higher IRMAA amount.

And just to complete this picture, you should be aware that IRMAA also applies to Medicare Part D premiums. And that means that those with higher incomes who are affected by IRMAA for Part B will also pay a higher Medicare Part D premium. (Medicare Part D is private insurance coverage for prescription drugs). But none of this is related to your Social Security benefit amount.
